## Police Accident Report

# Flaming Snowmobile Crash Injures 2

Serious accidents were reported last week in Vaughan and Whitchurch Townships, while Markham Township was pretty well accident free and Richmond Hill had only one minor crash.

At Lake Wilcox a snowmobile hit a parked car January 31 and burst into flames. Both riders had broken bones.

Also in Whitchurch, a head-on crash of two cars January 29 on Don Mills Road near Bethesda injured five people and totally wrecked the cars to the tune of \$4,500 in cost.

In Vaughan, two local women drivers had a collision January 26. Damage was estimated by police at \$2,500. Both drivers had injuries, one suffering fractures which confined her to York Central Hospital.

In the Lake Wilcox snowmobile accident there were a number of the machines in the area at about 10 pm, having some Saturday fun.

Donald Ash, 31, of South Road, Lake Wilcox, was riding his machine on Wilcox Road, Oak Ridges, along with his wife Ruth. They struck a parked car belonging to Angelo Benedetti of Wilcox Road. The snowmobile caught fire, but the fire was immediately extinguished with snow by the other people there.

Mr. Ash and his wife were in fair condition in York County Hospital, Newmarket. He had a broken right leg and she had a broken cheek bone and multiple face and head lacerations. Damage was \$550 to the snowmobile and \$50 to the car. These snowmobiles have gasoline tanks on the front and frequently catch fire in a collision, police said.

The head on crash near Bethesda took place at 6:05 pm

January 29 on slippery roads. One of the injured were travellers, four from Keswick and one from Toronto. One had a fractured jaw and another had chest injuries, police said.

The injury collision in Vaughan Township was on Maple Sideroad and Jane Street. Hazel Burbridge of Concession 5, Lot 31, Maple, is in hospital with fractures and had \$1,000 damage to her vehicle.

The other driver, Lyn Wittemann of 170 Bayview Avenue, Richmond Hill, was immediately released from hospital. Her vehicle had damage estimated at \$1,500, Vaughan Police report.

There were three other accidents in Vaughan Township. On the Department of Lands and Forests property on Dufferin Street North January 30 there was a two vehicle collision. James Laing of Elgin Mills Road West, Richmond Hill, had \$400 damage and Am-brose Young of 9120 Yonge Street, Richvale, had \$350 damage.

On Teston Road west of Keele January 29 a passing car hit a parked vehicle. Michele Giancola of Burr Avenue, Toronto, had \$250 damage and Samuel Hawkins of RR 1, Maple, had \$50 damage, police estimated.

Saturday, January 31, on Concession 10, north of Nashville Road, Andrew Brimmer of 20 Collins Crescent, Aurora, had a collision with George Gregg of Tollington Road, Weston. Mr. Gregg had the worst of it, having \$500 damage. Mr. Brimmer had \$50 damage, police estimated.

Richmond Hill's lone accident was at 10:28 pm January 30 on Yonge Street South.

Raymond Godin of East Gwillimbury had \$100 damage to his parked vehicle. Lum Kai Yam, 59, of 368 Yonge Street North, was southbound and had \$150 damage, town police said.

**Sex Education In Public Schools "Too Little, Too Late" — Parent**

Wrixon Hall was filled to capacity Monday evening when the community sponsored series on "The Family and Sex Education" held its initial program. Rev. David McGuire welcomed the audience, composed for the most part of young and middleaged parents, with a sprinkling of teenagers and grandparents. Mrs. Dorothy Francis introduced Moderator Helen James who in turn introduced members of the panel, Bob McDonald, Mrs. Marylo Graham, Dr. Manzer Bunker, Mrs. Judith Sule and Rev. Ron Owston. The topic was "The How, Why and When of Sex Education."

"Who's to blame", asked Bob McDonald, "for the lack of communication between parents and children?" He felt that society has made sex and drugs more tempting and desirable to young people by the very fact of prohibition, but that parents have the responsibility of teaching their children about these matters.

Mrs. Graham, speaking as a parent, said that parents should teach their children step by step, preparing them for changes which will occur. "If our own attitudes toward sex are joyful and mature, our children will develop these same attitudes."

Dr. Bunker said sex education was non-existent in the schools when he was a youngster, but now grade 5 pupils were taught the biology he learned at college. "Girls talk longer", he said amid laughter from the audience. "but boys stop talking at age eight or nine, therefore the opportunity must be there for them to ask questions, but the answers must be complicated. Children must learn to share, to love, to give and to get along with other people", he concluded.

Mrs. Sule said we assume that all parents are articulate, which is not the case. Parents think the schools will teach their children about sex if they do not. She cited examples ranging from the Sicilian mother to whom sex is as natural as eating, the disciplinarian mother who doesn't approve of sex education in the schools and who feels 21 is soon enough to discuss the topic, to the hippie mother who carries her baby on her back, casually but joyously.

Mr. Owston felt children should not learn what they must unlearn later — storks, gooseberry bushes, etc. In Victorian times sex was very important as eating, the disciplinarian mother who doesn't approve of sex education in the schools and who feels 21 is soon enough to discuss the topic, to the hippie mother who carries her baby on her back, casually but joyously.
