The board's curriculum planning and development committee had its first meeting recently to lay out guidelines for development of curriculum in the separate schools over the next five years.

Superintendent Joe Hodge reported to the trustees that the purpose of the committee is to involve principals in grass roots planning of the development of education facilities, resources, programs and personnel.

The committee agreed that the separate schools of York County should be permitted to be unique in character, with every school developing in such a way as to develop a complete school unit in terms of facilities, personnel and programs. Even though schools might differ one from the other however, there should be a common standard of equality of educational opportunities for all schools.

The committee's five year plan will have overall objectives for the system and local objectives for the school in its community, with immediate objec-

Principal Harold Dick of Oak Ridges School has accepted an appointment near his home in Burlington, and in September his place will be taken by Edward Burlew.

Mr. Burlew had 16 years experience in education in the United States, serving for nine years as a full time senior administrative principal. He is now completing his second year as principal of Kinghorn School in King Township.






