SUMMARY TO BY-LAW NUMBER 3920 By-law 2523 provides that for the purpose of computing the yard and set back requirements on certain streets, the limit of the street shall be considered as the planned width of the road allowance which is provided in Schedule "B" to the By-law.

As a result of planning and traffic studies the Township, by Amendment No. 17 to the Official Plan, revised the planned widths of many of the public highways in the municipality. The purpose of this by-law is to implement the provisions of Amendment No. 17. Schedule "B" designates specific highways as expressways, arterial roads and collector roads. Any highway which is not within one of these categories has a planned width of 66'. Schedule "B" designates expressways with a planned width of 300', arterial roads with a planned width of 120' and collector roads with a planned width of 86'.
