

Crash Kills Richmond Hill Woman

Mrs. Eleanor Ruth Jobe, 36, a resident of 242 Browndale Crescent, Richmond Hill, for close to four years, died last Saturday after being in a collision in this car at Highway 7 and Yonge Street.

Five-year-old Barbara Jobe, a daughter, suffered lacerations to the right side of her face and was in York Central

Hospital for several days. Driver of the car southbound on Yonge was Leonard Jobe, 38. He and two other children in the family, David aged 10

and Bruce aged 9, were treated and released from hospital after the accident. The family originally came from Toronto and had lately also lived in Newmarket.

John Porietis, 23, of Pefferlaw, driver of an eastbound Land Rover Jeep, rolled 40 feet across Yonge Street's northbound lane after the collision, but suffered only minor injuries.




