Another major development in the reconstruction of Yonge Street began this week as Richmond Hill Hydro took the first steps towards the erection of a new modern street lighting system along the town's main street at an estimated cost of \$140,000. The old wooden poles will be removed and brand new spun concrete ones will be staggered on both sides of the street with a distance of 150 to 180 feet between each pole. The poles will be 37 feet high and each will display modern merc-

ury vapour lamps. There will be 20 fewer poles along Yonge and the whole area extending from Markham Road to Elgin Mills is scheduled to have the new lights. Once the hydro and sewer work is completed the actual task of rebuilding and widening the street will begin.


