Anonymous Donation Town Grant Family Services

Richmond Hill and Thornhill Family Services opened its doors on April 2 with a little more money in the bank than it had anticipated.

Members of the steering committee, which has been working for a year preparing for the opening, have announced that, after the first annual meeting of the Family Services on March 12, the committee received an anonymous gift of \$1,000. The meeting was addressed by Miss June Callwood, a founder of Digger House in Metro.

Since the treasurer reported at the annual meeting that the bank balance was \$9, this gift was particularly appreciated.

Temporary quarters are located in the office of Lawyer Robert Blackburn, 97 Yonge Street South. Mr. Blackburn is chairman of the centre's board of directors.

Appointments may be made through local ministers or doctors or by contacting the Toronto Institute of Human Relations direct at 364-5757. Rev. Carl Moore, presently United Church Chaplain at McMaster University in Hamilton, will be serving the centre part time as counsellor.

Various churches of the area have agreed to underwrite costs up to \$5,000 to make it possible to operate the centre one day a week for the remaining nine months of 1970, and at its budget meeting on Monday, the Town of Richmond Hill approved a grant of \$2,500 for the centre.

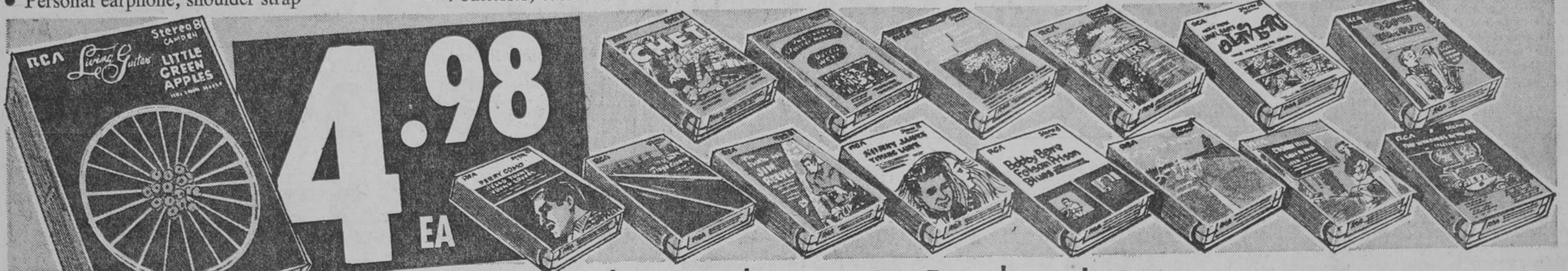
