Board Wants Lot Fee

 pal Affairs agrees that consideration should be given to making this source of revenue available to school boards as well as to municipal councils, although the method of doing this would be very complicated.
 It was intimated that when details were being developed the provincial officials would invite participation by the York County Board.
 The board had previously put its position on dwelling unit fees to a meeting of planning officials from the various municipalities of York County.
 At a meeting in the York County Offices in Newmarket on March 24, called by York County Planning Consultant Conroy Dowson and the planning committee of York County Council, the board's position on new building and capital debt charges was explained by Messrs. Chapman and Bacsalmasi.
 About half of the municipal representatives present agreed with the board need for a dwelling unit fee. Those who were opposed argued that educational services are services to people, not to property, and should not be paid for out of a tax on property.
 This was countered by Messrs. Chapman and MacKay who felt educational capital costs are not unlike sewers, roads, etc., and all could well be paid for by the developer on impact or lot levy.
 While he agreed that "there is evidence that there is some room to manoeuvre" with respect to impact on developers, Mr. Dowson felt that this would result in higher housing costs.
 Mr. Dowson called for increased financial aid from the province.
 "Unconditional grants would be welcome," he declared.
