## Healing Arts

After spending three and one half years as chairman of a three-man provincially appointed Committee on the Healing Arts, Ian Dowie of Bathurst Street, Vaughan Township has left on a one-year tour of the world.

The committee's report, which was released by Premier John Robarts late in April, covered all phases of the healing arts from the medical specialist to the hypotherapist, drawing attention to the strengths and weaknesses of various professional bodies from the Ontario Registered Nurses Association to the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons.

Born in England, Mr. Dowie was educated at the University of Edinburgh and came to Canada in 1938. Involvement in various business enterprises took him to Britain, the United States and several South American countries. He retired as president of Canadian Breweries Limited in 1965, and in 1969 was a member of the board of directors of York Central Hospital.

Other members of the Committee on the Healing Arts were Professor Horace Krever of the University of Western Ontario Law School in London, and Professor M. C. Urquhart of Queen's University in Kingston who is now living in California but will return to Kingston in the fall.

## Won \$1,000 Star Bond

The Andersons haven't decided what to do with the prize. "We might keep it and let it earn interest. Or we could pay off the car. Or maybe use it as a down payment on a house. We want to think about it for a while. It takes a long time to save \$1,000," he said.
