## Inquest To Be Held Highway Workman Killed In Accident

A King Township youth was the driver of a car which struck and killed a workman on Highway 11 north of Aurora at 7.55 am May 22.

Dead is Vincenzo Ienco, 44, of 556 Christie Street, Toronto.

Mr. Ienco walked from behind a parked truck into the path of a car driven by Robert Harrison, 18, of Lot 15, Concession 4 (RR 1, King City), police said.

Dr. Patrick Schofield coroner, said an inquest will be held next month. The time and place won't be set until the police investigation is completed, he said.

The accident is being investigated by Provincial Constable Don Dawson of the Oak Ridges OPP Detachment.

Three people were injured in car accidents in Vaughan Township last week, and a Richmond Hill child narrowly escaped being crushed under the wheels of a truck.

On May 22 at 3.25 pm a truck was northbound at Neal and Kerswell Drives. It was carrying seven tons of asphalt. The driver saw a child approaching on a bicycle and had barely enough time to stop and evade a serious accident.

Five-year-old Craig Parsons of 212 Alsace Road had only a bruised ankle and abrasions on his forehead.

John Davis, 20, of Markham was charged with dangerous driving May 23 after a 10-mile high speed chase.

Markham Township Police, aided by Whitechurch Township Police, conducted the pursuit. It began when police attempted to check two vehicles at Unionville between 11 pm and midnight.

One car raced away and was finally found upside down on Concession 6. Police listed the 1966 Dodge as worth about \$1,200 and completely wrecked.

Constable Ronald Reesor of the Markham Township Police was alone in a police cruiser that followed the escaping car.

Charges of careless driving and operating a motor vehicle without a license were laid May 22 against Douglas Byer, 16, of 245 Axminster Drive, Richmond Hill.

The charges followed a 3 pm accident on McConvey Drive. Byer's car turned off Neal and went out of control. It bounced through several ditches and ended up against a culvert, police said. The car was considered a complete write-off.

An impaired driving charge was laid May 24 against Allan Maguire, 24, of Downsview after a car went through a hedge and fence, and over a three-foot ditch at 1.40 am at the Centre Street dead end.

In a collision May 21 at 5.26 pm at Bayview Avenue and Markham Road, there was an estimated \$200 damage to a westbound car driven by Charles Brodie of Gormley. The southbound car was driven by Gail Hitchinson of 161 Felix Road, Richmond Hill and had an estimated \$150 damage.

Mrs. Olga Shaw of RR 3, King City, was injured and her car was considered a complete wreck May 22. Her car went out of control on Bathurst Street in Vaughan Township.

Another car driven by William Chard of Concession 6, King Township, went out of control May 23 on the King-Vaughan line. Damage was estimated at \$300.

## Losses In Monday's Thunderstorm Could Reach As High As \$100,000

What appears to have been a powerful whirlwind in a heavy thunderstorm Monday night demolished a garage, peeled the roof from an industrial building, smashed windows and toppled signs. Total damage could reach close to \$100,000.

The damage was mostly along Markham Road from Sussex Avenue to Yonge Street.

A Tareyton Road resident reports seeing the storm approaching about 6.30 pm.

Weather experts at Downsview airport report two heavy storms Monday night, one at 6.44 pm and one at 8 pm. The heavy winds were not felt at all at Downsview.

The weathermen say the areas of wind in thunderstorms move in cells and are quite often widely scattered. They said there were no reports of hurricanes Monday, but local residents were of the opinion that the damage could only have been caused by a "twister".

The worst damage occurred when the storm lifted the Scott's Ambulance Service garage on Markham Road up to roof level. The ambulance inside was left untouched, except for some exterior damage estimated at about \$400.

Robert Scott said two men tried to hold the garage down in the midst of the storm. But when a nearby billboard toppled with a terrific bang, the men ran for shelter in the office. The ambulance looked just like it had been mauled by some huge animal. It looked like the pieces of the garage were whirling around the ambulance, twisting and scratching off a light, and scratching the vehicle all over, Mr. Scott said.

Floating at roof level, the ambulance garage caught the edge of the roof of an industrial building at 301 Markham Road. The roof covering was peeled off, leaving only the bare steel deck. Then the rain poured in. The building is owned by John Griffin Construction Ltd., Bathurst Street.

At press time John Griffin said there was no estimate of damage available as yet from the insurance adjusters. The heaviest loss would be in the building's contents. He said a quick early estimate of the loss, including ambulance garage, roof, and building contents, would be something like \$50,000.

The building was occupied by Mayfair Manufacturing Co. Ltd. and Texas Instruments Supply Company.

At Mayfair, 2,000 dresses and 15,000 yards of fabric were watersoaked, along with all the
