Town Firemen To Compete In Aurora's Dominion Day Festival

Several members of the Richmond Hill Fire Department will participate in competitions July 1, as one part of Aurora's second annual Dominion Day celebrations.

Competing in a variety of events, the Richmond Hill squad will tangle with teams from Aurora, Newmarket, Mount Albert and Sutton.

The firemen's events get under way at 11 am at the park adjacent to the community centre.

The two-day birthday celebration, which last year attracted more than 15,000 people, begins June 30 at 8 pm with opening ceremonies at the centre.

Highlight of the affair is a huge beer garden, scheduled for the afternoon of Dominion Day. That night, a gala birthday party will begin at 9 pm, featuring Bobby Gimby's Orchestra, led by Jimmy MacDonald.

Other events scheduled for the celebration include a giant fireworks display, square dancing, a teen dance, a mammoth parade, children's races, and performances by the Aurora Musical Theatre Society.

A successful and unusual race staged last year, the balloon race, will return this year.

An Aurora boy won the event last year after his balloon was discovered 10 miles out into the Atlantic Ocean off the coast of Massachusetts.

The Aurora Jaycees chicken barbecue will also return this year, and meals will be available from noon to 6 pm July 1.

Canada's birthday town has arranged most events to be held at the community centre and the park adjacent to it. The centre is located on Aurora Heights Drive, west of Yonge Street in the north end of town.

Normal Daily Job In Prison Sentence For Shooting Girl

The Newmarket man convicted of manslaughter last week in the January 6 shooting death of Carol Anne Stevens will be setting an Ontario precedent as he spends his sentence working during the day at a normal job and sleeping each night at Mimico Reformatory.

Glen Fry, 22, was convicted after a high court jury deliberated 5 1/2 hours. Justice W. A. Donohue sentenced Fry to six months definite and 12 months indeterminate in reformatory.

The trial took three days in the Ontario Supreme Court.

The prosecuting attorney in the Newmarket preliminary hearing on a non-capital murder charge was Michael Lynch. William Babe was prosecutor during the trial. The defence atorney was Richmond Hill Lawyer Alfred Stong.

Justice Donohue, remarked that he believed he was setting a precedent in the Toronto area when he exercised his discretion under a new law that follows the court to recommend a convicted person be given leave to work at a regular job while under detention.

Miss Stevens, 19, roomed at the home of Fry's parents in East Gwillimbury Heights, a suburb of Newmarket. One morning, according to trial testimony, Fry picked up a rifle and it discharged. The .22 calibre bullet struck Miss Stevens in the temple.
