Wright Morrow Plans Retirement

After 25 years in the teaching profession, Wright Morrow, principal at Woodbridge High School since 1964, is retiring.

He first started to teach in 1945 when he left the RCAF at the end of World War II, and spent 19 years on staff at Richmond Hill High School, the last nine of them as principal, before being transferred to Woodbridge.

Mr. Morrow has lived in Richmond Hill ever since he began his teaching career, specializing in health and physical education and teaching science and mathematics. The Morrows have a daughter, Joan, a registered nurse with Canadian Pacific Airlines, and a son, John, a teacher at Cedarbrae Secondary School in Scarboro.

The Morrows live at 130 Wright Street, and for years have been active members of Richmond Hill United Church. Mr. Morrow's plans for the future are rather vague at the moment. "I will probably start a new career," he told "The Lib-

His place at Woodbridge will be taken by Principal Jack Edwards of Thornhill Secondary School, who in turn will be succeeded by Vice-Principal William Me-

In presenting his resignation from Thornhill to the York County Board of Education earlier this year, Mr. Edwards explained that, after 25 years in the profession, he would like to get back to a closer association with the students.

Woodbridge has an enrolment of 307, and Thornhill an enrolment of nearly 1,000. In such a large school, said Mr. Edwards, a principal has little opportunity to actually get to know the students.
