Wright Morrow Plans Retirement

After 25 years in the teaching profession, Wright Morrow, principal at Woodbridge High School since 1964, is retiring.

He first started to teach in 1945 when he left the RCAF at the end of World War II, and spent 19 years on staff at Richmond Hill High School, the last nine of them as principal, before being transferred to Woodbridge.

Mr. Morrow has lived in Richmond Hill ever since he began his teaching career, specializing in health and physical education and teaching science and mathematics. The Morrrows have a daughter, Joan, a registered nurse with Canadian Pacific Airlines, and a son, John, a teacher at Cedarbrae Secondary School in Scarborough.

The Morrrows live at 130 Wright Street, and for years have been active members of Richmond Hill United Church. Mr. Morrow's plans for the future are rather vague at the moment. "I will probably start a new career," he told "The Liberal".

His place at Woodbridge will be taken by Principal Jack Edwards of Thornhill Secondary School, who in turn will be succeeded by Vice-Principal William McVicar.

In presenting his resignation from Thornhill to the York County Board of Education earlier this year, Mr. Edwards explained that, after 25 years in the profession, he would like to get back to a closer association with the students.

Woodbridge has an enrollment of 307, and Thornhill an enrollment of nearly 1,000. In such a large school, said Mr. Edwards, a principal has little opportunity to actually get to know the students.

Rescue Squad Frees Injured Man After \$4,400 Three-Car Collision

Spectacular accidents came close to claiming two lives in Markham and Vaughan Townships last week.

One man had to be pried out of his wrecked vehicle by the Vaughan Township Fire Department's Rescue Squad after a \$4,400 three-car crash at 11 am Monday morning at Keele Street and Snidercroft Road,

south of Highway 7 West. Still unconscious at press time in Toronto General Hospital after his car cart-wheeled five times at 4:10 pm June 20 on Concession 5, Markham Township, was Fred Burton, 45, of 55 Cree Avenue, Scarborough. Mr. Burton suffered head injuries when he was thrown 45 feet from his cart-wheeling ve-

hicle as the driver's door and trunk were torn off. The car was southbound about 300 yards south of 18th Avenue when it went out of control for unknown reasons, Markham Township Police said. It sheared off a telephone pole and continued south over end parts, spinning end over end. Parts of the totally wrecked

1969 model car were strewn over the roadside field. After the three-car Vaughan Township accident, driver William Lester of Keele Street, Toronto, received preliminary treatment for suspected chest, right leg and knee fractures at York Central Hospital before being transferred to St. Michael's Hospital. His car had an estimated \$2,500 damage.

Mrs. Margaret Lester was treated at York Central Hospital for broken bones in her hand and injuries to her left arm and shoulder. She went home from hospital June 21. Another driver in the three-car Vaughan crash, Peter Keller of Don Mills, was treated for minor injuries at York Cen-

tral Hospital and sent home. His car had an estimated \$1,600 worth of damage, police said. The third driver was Andrew Sharp of Brampton. His damage was about \$300.

Head cuts and \$1,000 damage were suffered by John Henderson, 27, of RR 2, Stouffville at 12:50 am June 20 when his car went out of control and hit a ditch on the Bloomington Road at Concession 9, according to Whitechurch Township Police. Russell Lee, 20, of RR 2, Stouffville also had his car go out of control at about 1 am June 20, as he was driving along the Aurora Sideroad at Concession 9 on a curve. He had an estimated \$600 damage, Maple.

Whitechurch Police said. There were also two minor accidents in Vaughan on the weekend. Kathleen Bell of Willowdale had about \$250 damage and Murray Higgins of Toronto had about \$200 damage in a Yonge-view accident June 19. Allan Chapell, Lynett Crescent, Richmond Hill had a \$400 single-car accident June 21 at Concession 9 on a curve. He and Richmond Street, had an estimated \$600 damage, Maple.

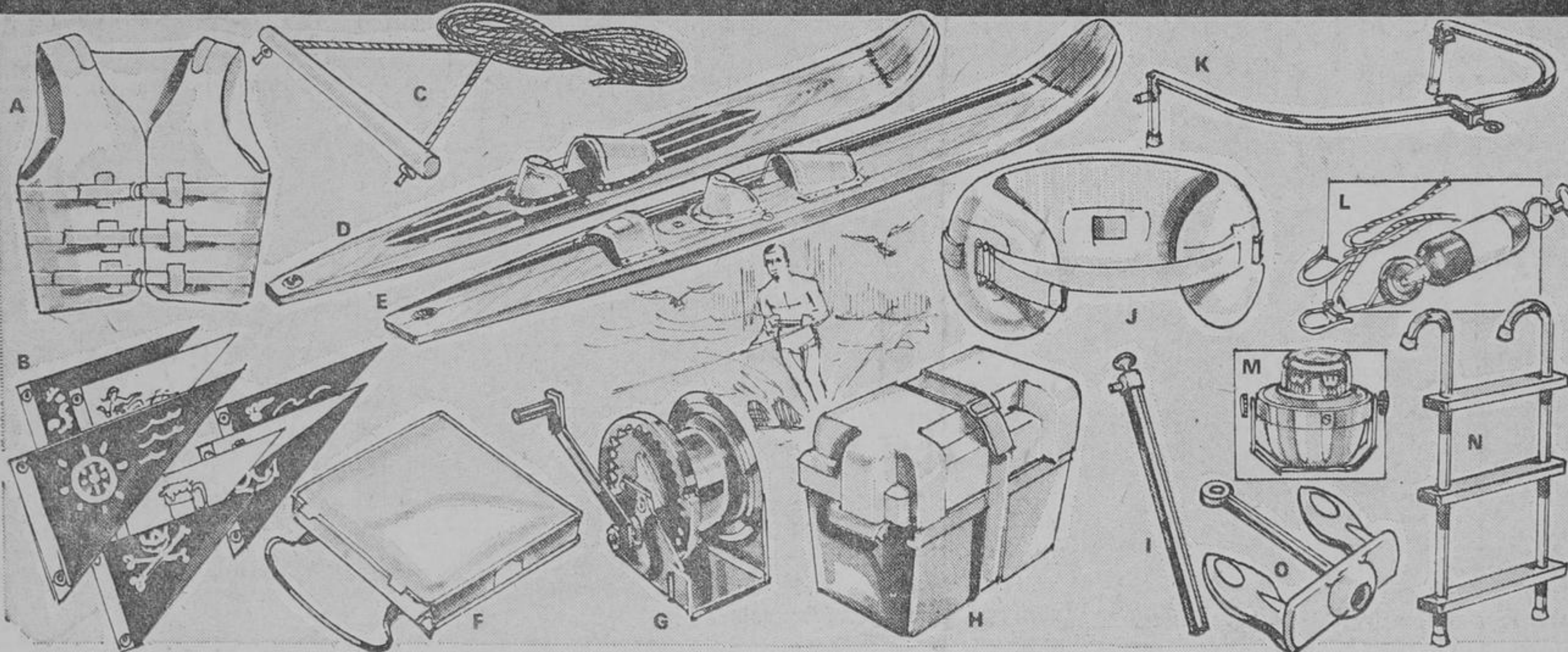

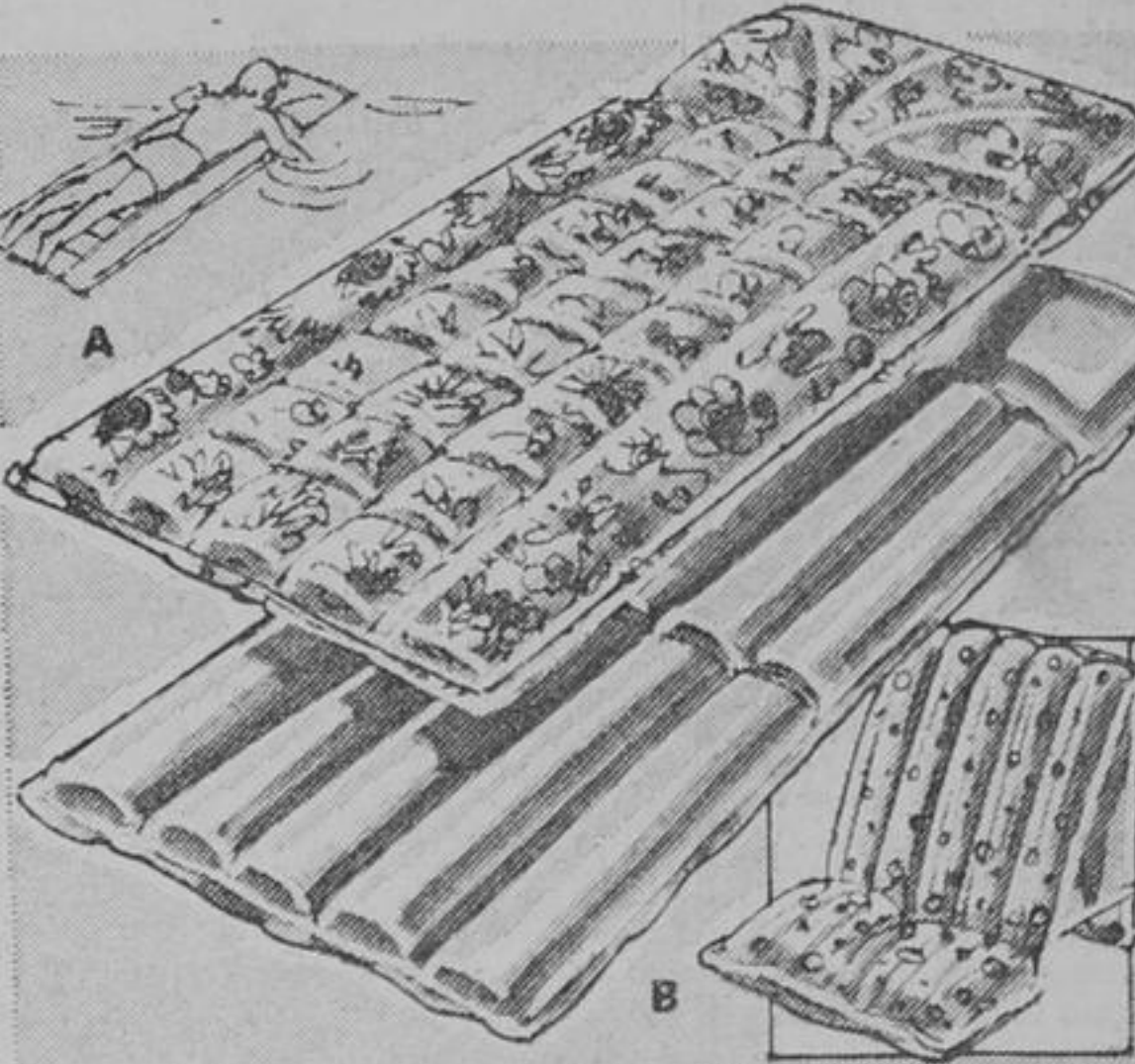

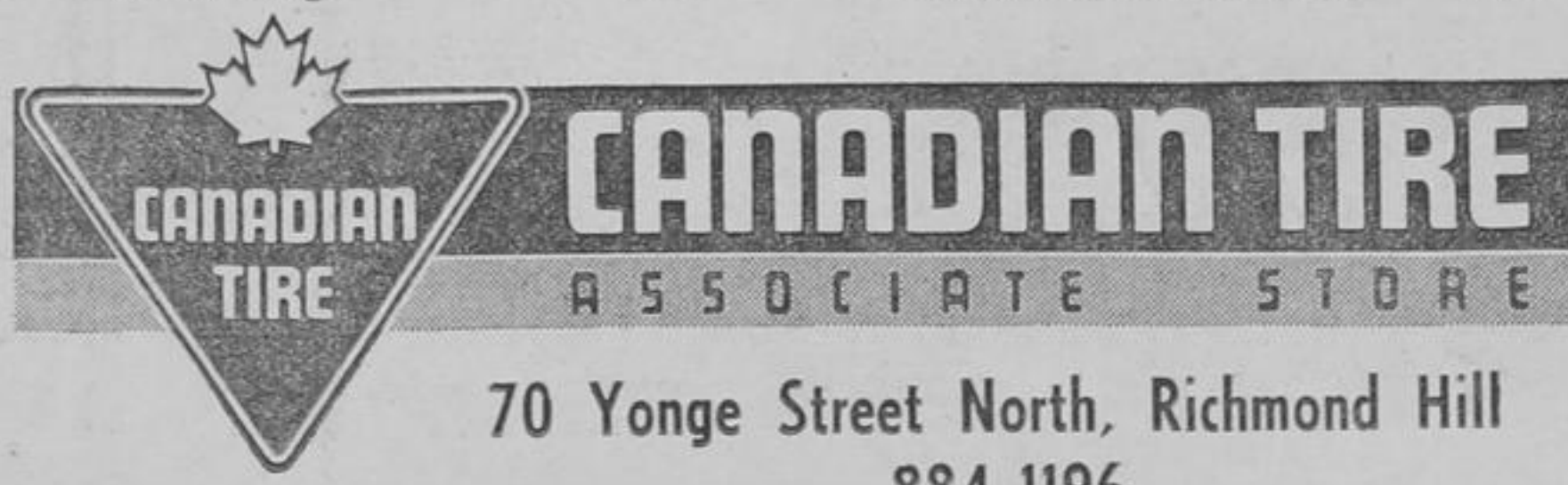
