

Bob Domik Hurls, Hits Jewellers To 6-2 Victory Over Scarborough

Richmond Hill Dynes Jeweller Hurler Bob Domik stole the show from his own pitching arm Thursday night of last week as he almost brought rain to the scene with two booming home runs.

His blows plus four other runs carried the Jewellers to a 6-2 win over Scarborough M and J at the town park and moved them into undisputed possession of first place in the Oshawa City and District Major Fastball League.

Dynes lead the loop with 12 points off six wins and two losses, two points ahead of second place Oshawa Gale Lumber and four points in front of third place Oshawa Tony's.

Domik also came up with an effective if not overpowering pitching performance limiting Scarborough to five hits over nine innings and striking out 10 batters.

On the same day, commencing at 3:15 p.m. Toronto time, the tenders will be opened and read publicly by the Commission's Tender Committee in the Conference Room, 8th Floor, at the above mentioned address.

The work consists generally of supplying materials and equipment for, and the construction of an 85 foot diameter concrete clarifier, an above ground pumping station with wet well and dry well, 385 lineal feet of 12" diameter force-main, 375 lineal feet of 6" diameter forcemain, 175 lineal feet of 24" diameter sewer, alterations to the existing pollution control plant influent works, channelization of a watercourse, and other related appurtenances.
