Thornhill Boy Scouts Save 3 From Drowning

Three young Thornhill Scouts are credited with saving the lives of three other boys, Victoria Day weekend. Scouts George Beardwood, 14, Bob Mc-Crimmon, 14 and Bruce Rozycki, 13, are members of the 2nd Thornhill Troop which was camping on an island in Eugenia Lake, near Flesherton.

Shortly after midnight May 17, four teenagers from a nearby group of high school students left the island in a small aluminum boat for the mainland. When the boat was some distance offshore, it capsized, throwing the four occupants into the cold

The three young Scouts became aware that there had been a mishap, and went to help, launching a heavy aluminum outboard boat. They reached the accident scene quickly and were able to rescue three of the boys floundering in the water. Although they searched for the fourth boy they could find no trace of

More help was summoned from nearby cottages and the search was continued for some time, without success.

It is quite probable the three boys who were rescued would also have drowned in the extremely cold water, which was 30 to 40 feet deep, but for the prompt action of the Thornhill Scouts.

York Summit District salutes and commends these young lads from 2nd Thornhill and it is hoped that their brave deed will be recognized by the proper authorities.
