The courses include the usual basic tuition of breathing control, tongue exercises, concentration, improvisation and facial exercises. The students are given passages to study and memorize, and have an opportunity to present them before the class and the instructor for criticism and suggestions for improving their performances. I watched selections from such varied works as "Ondine", "A Midsummer Night's Dream", "Dad Poor Dad", "Marat-Sade" and "The Importance of Being Ernest". Some of the performers showed very obvious talent, and their instructor was quick to encourage them and to offer advice. Some had memorized commercials or written their own, and the results were sometimes convincing.

At the conclusion of their training the young hopefuls are auditioned at Trainco, and their performances video-taped to give an idea of their potential as television performers. The successful ones, of course, become part of the pool of talent from which the agency can draw.

The director of these courses is Tony Maffat-Lynch, an actor and dancer who trained at the famous Italia Conte School in London, England, followed by extensive experience in repertory theatre. On coming to Canada five years ago, he worked with George Luscombe's Workshop Productions in Toronto for three years before returning to England for **RUMBLE TRANSPORT** a further tour in repertory.

He recently played a lead role in the movie "Flick", made by Agincourt Productions.
