

A new two-storey addition to the Falconbridge Metallurgical Laboratories on Yonge Street at Roosevelt Drive, Richvale, is well underway. Above is a rear view showing work progressing on this third extension the company has made to its laboratories since their inception in 1953. Construction is expected to be completed by mid-September this year.

The present 4,800 square-foot addition is a steel frame, block wall structure, faced with white brick, approximately 40 feet by 60 feet and 25 feet high. General contractor is Trist Construction Co. Ltd., Toronto. Designers are R. G. Watson Co. Ltd., consulting engineers, also of Toronto. Electrical and mechanical contracts are held by McGregor Associates Limited.



AREA MUNICIPALITY OF THE TOWN OF VAUGHAN

Note:

The Town of Vaughan will be comprised of the lands within the Township of Vaughan less Lots 36 to 60 in the 1st Concession with the addition of the lands within the Village of Woodbridge and the lands in the Township of King being Lot 1 in Concessions 2 to 11 inclusive.

Preparation of Voters' List

An election will be held in the Area Municipality of the Town of Vaughan on October 5th, 1970 for the following: (a) The Council for the Area Municipality of

the Town of Vaughan. (One member of the said Council will also be elected as a member of the Council of the Regional Municipality of York.)

(b) Members of the York County Board of Education. (c) Members of the York County Roman

Catholic Separate School Board. A preliminary list of owners and tenants who are eligible to vote at the election has been prepared from the last revised Voters' Lists and supplementary information.

Posting of Voters' List

On August 7th, 1970, copies of the Voters' List were posted in the following places:

1. Office of the Clerk, Village of Woodbridge. 2. Office of the Clerk, Township of King.

3. Office of the Clerk, Township of Vaughan.

4. Maple Post Office.

5. Woodbridge Post Office.

6. Pine Grove Post Office. 7. Concord Post Office.

8. Nashville Post Office. 9. Kleinburg Post Office.

10. Other prominent places throughout the area. Information as to these locations can be obtained through the office of the Returning Officer.

Qualification of Voters

In addition to those persons ordinarily entitled to vote, every person who is a British subject, of the full age of 21 years and not disqualified under the Municipal Act, or otherwise by law prohibited from voting, and is resident in the Village of Woodbridge or those parts of the Townships of Vaughan and King as defined above, for the period between the 1st day of January, 1970, and the 5th day of October, 1970, is entitled to be added to the Voters' List.

Revision of Voters' List

Application may be made by any person who complains that any name has been omitted from the list or that the names of persons who are not entitled to be voters have been entered on the list, to the Returning Officer in his office at Maple on any day except Sunday or a legal holiday during the period from the 11th day of August to the 29th day of August inclusive, on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m., and on Saturdays between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m., and also on the 14th day of August and the 21st day of August between the hours of 7:30 p.m. and 9:00 p.m.
