Public Meeting On Development Elgin Mills - Bayview 80 Acres

A proposed apartment-housing development complex with a potential population of 4,700 on the northwest corner of Elgin Mills Sideroad East and Bayview Avenue was laid before Richmond Hill Planning Board recently.

The proposed development involves some 80 acres of land, part of that annexed from Markham Township two years ago, primarily for industrial development. In Richmond Hill's new official plan these 80 plus acres are designated for residential use. Approval of the proposal would necessitate implementation of a secondary plan involving zoning changes.

For the developer, a representative of the engineering firm of Marshall Macklin Monaghan Limited urged the board to approve the proposal tentatively even though an actual start on the project could be some time away because of lack of servicing.

After hearing the application, the board decided to call a public meeting for September 8 at 8:30 at the municipal building, so it may assess the feelings of present residents of this area.

The proposal calls for 17 acres of high density apartment buildings, 25 acres of medium density housing and 12 acres of single family residences in the north-east corner. Other acreage involves space for a school, parkland, roads and easements.

Planning Board Chairman Harry Sayers pointed out to the representatives that the board would not proceed without an immediate public hearing, because there are residents affected who are not directly connected with the area involved.

He noted approval of the secondary plan would be the first logical step after the public meeting. Secondary plans follow establishment of an official plan and are concerned with the actual rezoning as suggested in the master plan.

It was Board Member Howard Whillans who first urged a public meeting before any "secondary plan is considered to hear the feelings of residents affected by it".

One of the developer's spokesmen voiced the opinion that calling a public meeting before the board made up its own mind is "planning by referendum." He felt the public meeting should be held later.

Mr. Sayers countered with the fact that there are other property owners involved, not within the actual complex, and "it is almost essential that we discuss the proposal with them first".

Councillor Lois Hancey agreed the public should be informed but said she was not averse to first "adopting a secondary plan in principle".

CAR WASH

In other business the board approved in principle—subject to a site plan agreement — an application by Gulf Oil to locate a fully serviced automatic car wash and gas bar on the east side of Yonge Street, just north of Wilson-Niblett Motors Ltd.

The drive-in loop of this operation will accommodate 38 cars with one car being completely serviced every 40 seconds in each of the two bays.

Also considered at the public meeting held Tuesday evening was the proposed development on the extension of Centre Street West.
