Hunter Drownings Are Down In Past 3 Years

A reduction in the number of hunters drowned over the past three years has been reported by officials of the Department of Lands and Forests.

Prior to 1967 there were usually from two to three times the number of hunters drowned as fatally wounded by firearms.

Four years ago the department incorporated boating safety in their hunter safety training program in co-operation with the Ontario Safety League.

The effects of this educational efforts brought immediate results with actually fewer hunters drowned in 1967 than those killed by firearms in the marshes and uplands.
