The course on world religions was offered as part of the social science program at Thornlea, but in June the board was advised by the Department of Education that it was not approving courses on world religion at the present time as the matter is under review. At a meeting October 26 the board was advised that Education Minister William Davis plans to have guidelines for such courses available in 1971. The trustees agreed, however, that it should ask now that the course be re-introduced on an experimental basis at Thornlea in the hope that it could begin next September.

and actions of men tend to be governed by some set of general ideas about the nature of the world and man's place in it. But in the majority of our students today this set of ideas is at best a dim background in their minds. Their entire culture is built upon something that is far too frequently ignored and all too often taken for granted by them.

The course guideline suggests that because of the apparent rejection by today's youth of the two dominant religions of our culture, Christianity and Judaism, it might be better to begin with religions of another culture, one where they would be less prejudiced and in which they would be initially more interested.

The introduction to the course suggests that, hopefully, the student would come to possess a greater sense of responsibility for his own thoughts and actions as well as a deeper respect for people unlike himself. This would then form the basis for continuing studies into Judaism and Christianity.

Plan Church Offices 125-Year-Old Home
The 125-year-old "Old Manse" of Richmond Hill Presbyterian Church will soon enter a new phase of activities. Monday evening October 26 at a congregational meeting, it was decided that the building should be converted into church offices and meeting rooms.
The building, erected in 1845 to house Rev. James Dick, the fourth minister to serve the congregation which dates back to 1817, is believed to be of rather unique construction. The exterior walls are built of one inch thick planks, six inches wide, piled one on top of the other.
When Mr. Dick, who was also the first superintendent of education for the township of Vaughan, retired in 1877, the "New Manse" was built to house his successors (and subsequent incumbents) and Mr. Dick was granted the use of the older home and a \$200 annual honorarium for the remainder of his life.
After his death in 1885, the building became the home of the church caretaker and served that purpose until mid-August of this year, when Julius Bork resigned from that position.
The building is structurally sound, it was reported, but a more satisfactory heating system and additional electric wiring will probably be needed and the old living-room floor will have to be levelled during restoration work, it is believed.
The brick foundation for the large fireplace which provided heating and cooking facilities in the house's early years is still in existence, it was reported. The fireplace was replaced by stoves and eventually by a space heater.
