**CHOCOLATE MARSHMALLOWS**  
1 pkg. Christie Chocolate wafers  
1 can Eagle Brand condensed milk  
2-3 cups miniature marshmallows  
Coconut  
Crush the wafers with a rolling pin or jar. Add full can of condensed milk and mix well. Add marshmallows and blend together.  
Butter a small square pan and place a layer of coconut on the bottom.  
Place wafer mixture on top and pat down with a wet spoon or spatula (mixture will be thick and sticky). Cover with another layer of coconut.  
Cover with Saran wrap or wax paper and put in refrigerator for at least 3-5 days.
