

A Pap Test saved my life



A quiet little man who became a giant in the history of cancer research. Dr. George Papanicolaou, who was born in Greece in 1883 and died in Florida in 1962, has saved the lives of OMHA etens of thousands of women. Known as Dr. Pap, he invented a simple test for detecting changes in the cells of the cervix before they turn to (Cancer, or when cancer is at an early and easily curable stage.

It was this device, known as the Pap Test, which saved the life of Mrs. Theresa Smith of London, Ontario. -Luckily, in 1965, Mrs. Smith was a medical technologist at St. Joseph's Hospital in London and therefore knew about the Pap Test and had one. It showed she had a malignant tumor confined to one spot on the cervix. She underwent a series of radiation treatments and in six weeks she was cured of the cancer.

"If I hadn't been working with the cytology department, I wouldn't have had a test," she said, "because I had no symptoms. I think all women over the age of 25 should have a Pap Test every two years - it's so If you would like to learn more about this life-saving test, speak to your doctor or call your local unit of


