Bomb Scare At Whitchurch School

Two men were arrested inside the house for breaking and entering. The car driver was also charged.
Appearing in Richmond Hill Provincial Court following this incident, and charged with burglary, were: Raymond Greco, 35, of Dufferin Street, Toronto; Melville Armstrong, 35, Booth Avenue, Toronto; and Edward Church, 40, of Cobalt, Ontario.
All three were remanded until December 1 and released on bail.
