Your Legion Reports Inquest: Jury Says Town Garbage Trucks Should Carry 2 Men, One Driving

Garbage trucks should carry two men, one of them being a driver only, a Richmond Hill Inquest Jury recommended December 1.

The jury also felt the Department of Transport should approve private alterations to commercial vehicles before licenses are issued.

The inquest was held to inquire into the circumstances surrounding the death of 22-month-old Blair James Philip, son of Glen and Jane Philip, 378


