Police Accident Report

Truck Driver Thrown Into Roadway

Wilfred Morton, 40, of 73 Wright Street, Richmond Hill, narrowly escaped death or serious injury December 18 when he was knocked from the top of a loaded truck into the roadway.

He was adjusting a chain holding the load on his truck at about 12:30 pm on Woodbine Avenue (formerly Don Mills Road) when another truck came by. The passing vehicle sent him spinning into the road, but luckily there was no more traffic immediately upon him.

Mr. Morton had a bone chip in his back and bruises on his left knee. He will be away from work for a while, but was able to go home to recover.

The driver of the other truck was Leo Ryan, 47, of 59 Font-hill Boulevard, Unionville.

The accident took place near the intersection of Woodbine with Esna Park Drive. There was no damage to the two trucks involved.

Damage was heavy in a head-on collision December 13 at about midnight on Steeles Avenue, 1/2-mile east of Leslie Street. Both drivers were injured.

Edward Aukema, 27, of 69 Crestwood Road, Thornhill, had injuries to his legs and right wrist, plus head lacerations. His car had an estimated \$3,000 damage.

Thomas Mangoff, 26, of 266 Jones Avenue, Toronto, had both legs cut and damage estimated at \$1,000, Markham Township Police said.

Hurrying to cross the corner to catch his school bus at 8:30 am December 14, Oliver Merk, 6, was in collision with a car on Henderson Avenue at Clark.

Driver of the small imported car involved was William Hargrave, 40, of 94 Proctor Avenue, Thornhill.

Oliver, whose home is at 116 Morgan Avenue, Thornhill, suffered only slight bruises to his left side, and was back at school the next day.

In the third local collision between a train and a motor vehicle in as many weeks, there was \$500 damage at about 6:25 pm December 17.

Unlike the previous two such accidents, nobody was killed in this one.

George McLeary, 21, of 8 Charade Court, Agincourt, was on the sewer plant road near Unionville when his truck stalled at the CN railway crossing.

McLeary ran east along the tracks attempting to stop an approaching Budd Dayliner. But he wasn't in time and the train hit the truck. Nobody was hurt.

A hit and run driver is being sought by Richmond Hill Police after an estimated \$300 damage was done to a car parked opposite 314 Demaine Crescent, between 2:30 am and 11:40 am Sunday.

The damaged car belongs to James Skakie of 314 Demaine Crescent.

Two Richmond Hill drivers were charged with failing to yield the right-of-way after stopping at a stop sign last week. Both were involved in accidents.

Total damage was estimated at \$1,200, plus the cost of a "no parking" sign at 10 am Saturday at Colbourne and Elmwood Avenues.

Charged was Robert Harper, 21, of 186 Colbourne Avenue. The other driver was Donald MacLean, 28, of 401 Elmwood Avenue.
