Catholic Trustees Honor Board Chairman And Retiring Members

York County Roman Catholic Board had its last meeting for 1970 in the administrative building, Richmond Hill, on December 15, ending with a reception for retiring trustees.

Elected in December 1968, for a two year term, the board wound up its year-end business quickly. Two new trustees, elected in municipal elections October 5 to take office January 1 for the next two years, were present — Richmond Hill Trustee-Elect Father Francis Robinson and Trustee-Elect Alan Quesnelle of King Township.

Mr. Jacobs thanked the board's senior administrative staff and the wives of Board Chairman Eugene Jacobs of Thornhill and Vice-Chairman John LeClaire of Richmond Hill.

Reports on various committees were received and discussed, then Mr. LeClaire got to his feet to pay tribute to Chairman Jacobs, first chairman of the board which came into being in January, 1969, when numerous area boards were amalgamated to form the county board.

It had been a great achievement, said Mr. LeClaire, to bring together a board of 14 strangers from all parts of the county and mould it into a smoothly functioning administrative body.

On behalf of the board, he presented Mr. Jacobs with the gavel of office he has used for the past two years, affixing an inscribed brass plate to the stand. He also presented Mr. Jacobs with an inscribed bracelet.

Mr. Jacobs protested, "I do not think a person should be honored for doing a job he enjoys doing."

It had been a pleasure to serve, he continued, on a board that has developed into a smoothly operating team.

"This board has been a cornerstone for Catholic education in this county," Mr. Jacobs added, observing that it is about to lose four trustees, "Four pieces of the cornerstone."

He made presentations to Mr. LeClaire, Trustee Donald Ferguson of the Town of Markham, Markham Township Trustee Mrs. June Mallon and East Gwillibury Trustee Robert Simpson who did not seek a second term on the board.

Mr. Jacobs thanked the board on behalf of the board for the work of the four trustees, stressing Mr. Simpson's dedication to the area of religious education, Mr. Ferguson's contribution in liaison, Mrs. Mallon's work in public relations and "image building", and Mr. LeClaire's solid support as vice-chairman.

He spoke of Mr. LeClaire's earlier service as a trustee for the Richmond Hill Roman Catholic School Board, a member of the York South Regional Educational Committee, and the interim committee that preceded the county board.

Mr. Simpson and Mr. Ferguson were presented with silver mugs, Mrs. Mallon received a silver letter opener, and Mr. LeClaire a cigarette box all inscribed with the board crest and the name of the recipient.

Both Messrs Jacobs and LeClaire spoke with appreciation of the work of the administrative staff. Mr. Hodge replied, thanking the whole board for building a strong organization and expressing regret that some would not be back in January. Refreshments, including Christmas Cake and fancy cookies, were served from a table adorned with seasonal decorations.

Police Warn Thornhill Residents About Christmastime Burglars

Despicable Christmastime burglars ransacking Thornhill homes for gifts, liquor and money, have brought a warning from Markham Township Police Department.

Citizens are urged to be on the lookout for people knocking on doors and using an excuse to find out if homes are occupied.

In at least two instances last week the burglars are believed to have gone out the back door as residents arrived home.

Burglars struck four times in the Bayview Glen - Doncaster - Highland Park residential area last week, northeast of Steeles Avenue and Yonge Street.

In one instance a child's size 10 dress was among the items stolen. Children cried as they came home to find gift packages ripped open and strewn about, no longer a secret for Christmas.

Police ask that citizens should keep a sharp eye out and report anything suspicious in their neighborhood. It is particularly important to be able to describe and identify possible burglars on the prowl.

One resident arrived home last week and heard the back door slam. A neighbor out shovelling snow saw men run out across the yard, but didn't pay enough attention to give police a useful description.

In another instance, burglars left a \$1,000 color television set by the door in their hurry to escape as the family arrived home. A portable television was gone, however.

Police suggest that people should leave a light burning and possibly a radio playing when leaving a home empty.

Windows in two cars and a home were smashed by malicious persons December 19 in Richmond Hill.

A \$75 rear window was smashed in a car belonging to Robert Madsen of 83 Crestwood Road, Thornhill.

A rear window and a side window valued at \$175 were smashed in a car owned by Paul Duggan of Schomberg.

Both cars were sitting in the Richmond Inn parking lot and the damage was discovered at about 1 a.m.

There was about \$10 damage done when someone threw a snowball through a window at the home of Harold Melsness, 467 Windhurst Gate, at about 10:35 p.m.

A complete door for a 1969 Dodge Dart car was stolen from outside Wilson-Niblett Motors Limited, 355 Yonge Street North, during the night of December 16.

Police are investigating the alleged passing of a \$77.17 company payroll cheque December 3 at the Canadian Bank of Commerce, Yonge Street South. The cheque belonged to Helen Blanchard of 18 Richmond Street, whose signature was alleged to be forged.

Charged with impaired driving December 18 at about 11 p.m. in front of 92 Mill Street was Donald Monk, 18, of 7028 Yonge Street, Thornhill.
