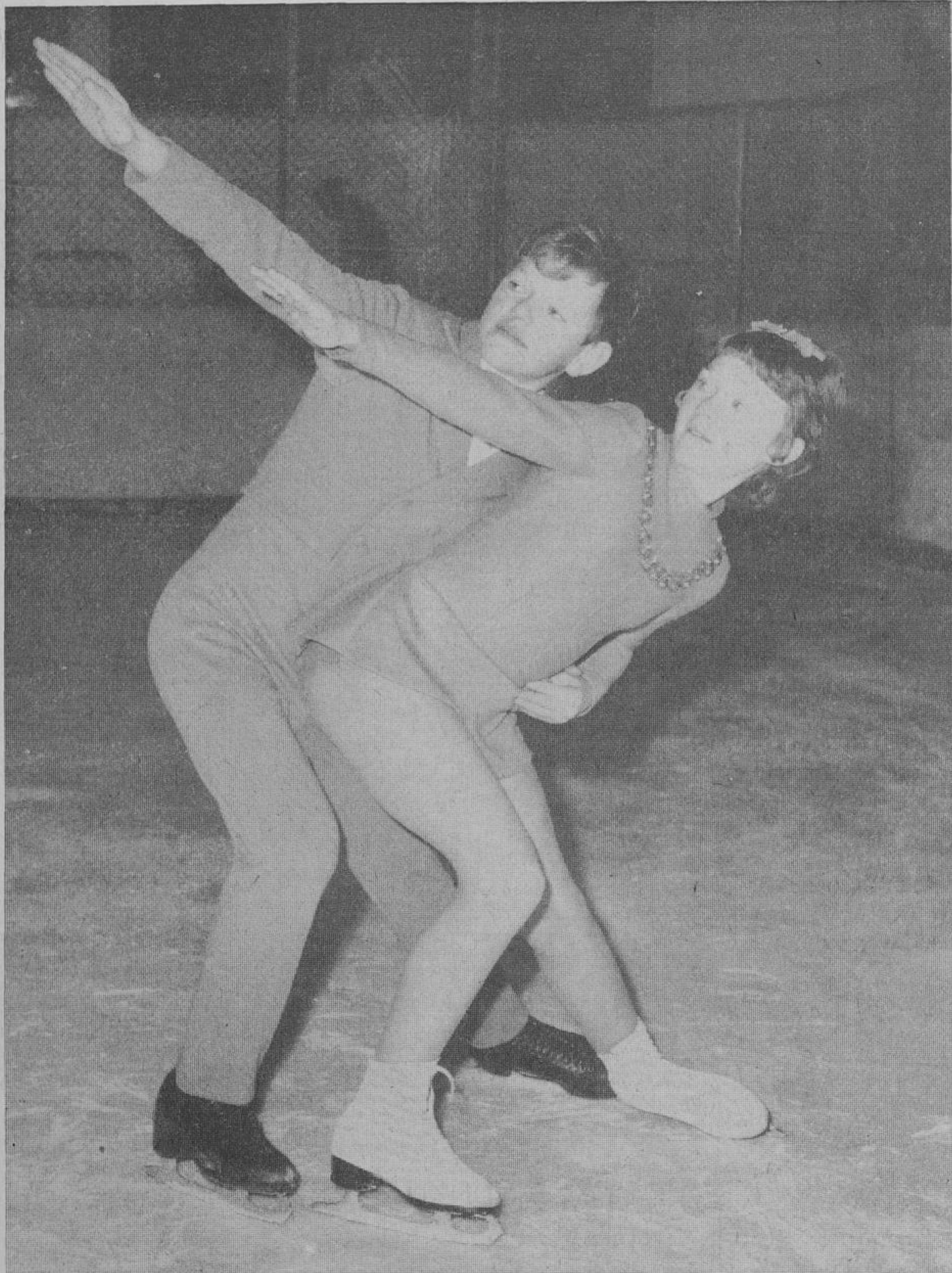

Gold Medal Winners At Winter Games

Last Wednesday, December 30, in the winter games at Etobicoke, Lindy Watts, 13 and Donald Fraser, 15 of the Richmond Hill Figure Skating Club came up with the Gold Medal in the "B" pairs division of the figure skating competitions. They are seen above during their routine.

These young skaters have been working together for only 18 months. In January 1970, at Barrie in the Central Ontario Sectionals they came in second. In the summer competitions at Lakeshore last August they came in second and then, in the winter games they took the top award — finishing first to win the gold medal.

Linda and Donald will be skating in the Central Ontario Sectionals held at the Credit Valley Figure Skating Club in Mississauga January 8, 9 and 10.

Their teacher is Rick Stephens of Port Perry.

Also skating for Richmond Hill in the Central Ontario Sectionals will be Donna Shubaly in the junior event and the lively Lynda Taylor, who won the sub-sectional event at Toronto. Police Accident Report

Wreck 2 Trucks, Car, Gas Pumps

There was a small fire easily extinguished by Vaughan Firemen about noon December 28 after a chain-reaction Thornhill collision that totally wrecked three vehicles and demolished \$2,000 worth of service station gasoline pumps. This accident was the biggest of more than a dozen that took a heavy toll of damage and minor injury last week in Southern York Region.

The driver of the wrecked food catering truck involved in the chain-reaction accident was charged by Markham Township Police and had a sore right arm. He was Severino Mitri, 22, of 49 Cherrylaw Avenue, Weston.

A witness to the accident was Mike Robertson of 139 Mill Street, Richmond Hill, and an Ottawa man.

The middle vehicle in the crash was another truck driven by Ronald Thornburn, 49 of RR 2, Gormley (Lot 10 Concession 4 of Markham).

The front vehicle was a car driven by William Oswald, 39, of 82 South Bend Road East. He was parked at the gas pumps of McQuay's Texaco Service Station on Woodbine Avenue (formerly Don Mills Road), about 1/4 mile south of Highway 7 when the accident happened.

Total damage was estimated at close to \$6,000.

Police are looking for a hit-and-run driver after a parked Datsun car was damaged at about 6:50 pm December 31 on Woodbine Avenue in Markham.

Vincent Buklis, 4 of Charlbrook Avenue, Barrie was the owner of the car parked on the east side of the roadway, just south of Buttonville Crescent East.

There was about \$250 to the rear and left side of this parked car, according to York Region Police.

Thornhill man were the drivers of cars that collided January 2 at Dufferin Street and Steeles Avenue.

Gloria Battick of Carrville Road had an estimated \$500 damage to her vehicle and Malcolm Laderman of 7 Portree Crescent had an estimated \$900 damage, York Regional Police in Vaughan said.

There was an estimated \$1,000 damage to a car driven by Thomas Carberry of RR 5, Bolton, in Vaughan January 1.

Carberry's car went out of control and crashed into a ditch beside County Road 49 near Nashville.

Two cars collided on Steeles Avenue West in Vaughan January 2.

Driver Alexandra Skerrett of Yonge Street, Willowdale, had damage estimated at only \$80.

But the other driver, Tika Verma of Jane Street, Downsview, had an estimated \$700, police said.

William Laycock, 58, of 202 Arnold Avenue, Thornhill, was driver of a car that had had heavy damage in a 5:10 pm collision December 28 at Highway 7 and Keele Street.

The other driver was Charles Waterman, 37, of 6844 Darcel Avenue, Malton. Damage totaled about \$1,100, it was estimated by investigating OPP Constable James Orris.

A passenger in the Waterman vehicle, Sarah Burling, 76, of 6844 Darcel Avenue, Malton, suffered a broken left arm.

Charged with failing to yield in a 3:10 pm December 31 accident at Trayhorn Drive and Yonge Street in Richmond Hill was Mrs. Bertha McHale of 49 DonMor Drive, Newmarket.

The other driver in this accident was Irene O'Connell of 1 Vendome Place, Don Mills. Damage totaled \$300.

Ursula Rewandowski of 123 Markham Road, Richmond Hill,

suffered an injured left hand and left knee in a \$600 collision at 12:35 pm December 30 at Newkirk Road and Centre Street.

The other driver in the crash, Patrick Gorman, 42, of Kennedy Road, Unionville, was charged with failing to yield the right-of-way.

At Steeles and Henderson Avenues in Thornhill at 1:47 pm December 29 there was a head-on collision, but damage was light.

Albert Johns, 41, 261 Arnold Avenue, Apartment 27, Thornhill, had an estimated \$150 damage and Brian Tathan, 17, of 190 Newton Avenue, Willowdale, had about \$75 damage.

Donald MacLean, 28, of 401 Elmwood Avenue, Richmond Hill, was judged by the police to be the innocent driver in the 10 am December 18 \$1,200 accident at Colbourne and Elmwood Avenues.

The other driver was charged with failing to yield the right-of-way after stopping at a stop sign.

A four-year-old Thornhill girl had both legs broken on the afternoon of December 30 while tobogganing with her family.

Kelly Cascone, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Vincent Cascone of 70 Romfield Circuit, was hurt on the first run made this winter with her father.

They slid down a ravine slope near Baythorn Drive, a short distance from Baythorn Elementary School.

The toboggan failed to stop in time, flew over the bank of a small stream, splashed into the water, and crashed against the bank on the other side.

Kelly is recovering at home after five days at North York General Hospital. She will have to wear casts up to the top of both legs for about six weeks, her mother told "The Liberal".

Add Five More Firemen Richmond Hill Brigade

Five permanent firemen have been added to Richmond Hill Fire Department in preparation for providing fire protection to the enlarged town after the advent of Regional Government on January 1, 1971.

The new firemen include Ron Fawn, Richmond Street; Larry Price, Rockport Crescent and Blair Robson, Bayview Avenue; all of Richmond Hill and they have been serving as volunteer firemen in the old town. Victor Ryman of Oak Ridges and David Bagley of May Avenue, Richvale complete the roster.

These five newcomers join the department as fourth class firemen for which the 1970 salary was \$6,400.

This brings the total of permanent men in the department to 14 men under Chief Alfred Stong. They are assisted by volunteers in the present Richmond Hill and it is hoped that the volunteers in the Richvale area will continue to serve under the new plan.

The extended area of the new Town of Richmond will be served from the Richmond Hill Fire Hall, located on . . . right Street, just west of the municipal building. A second storey has been added to this building, which will provide sleeping accommodation, a meeting room, instruction rooms and a lounge area. It will be manned around the clock.
