Drivers Stopped When Blinded By Sunday's Blowing Snow

4 Vehicles Damaged In Six Crashes

Bump - bang - crash - screech-whump went the cars again last week as blowing snow blinded drivers on wet and icy roads.

Sunday was the big day. There were six multiple-car crashes involving 41 vehicles that day.

An 11-car \$12,500 pile-up on Woodbine Avenue at Bethesda Sideroad in Whitchurch-Stouffville at 1:30 o'clock Sunday afternoon was the biggest crash.

Further along Woodbine (formerly Don Mills Road) at St. John Sideroad there were several more big crashes.

One at 1:50 pm involved four vehicles and \$2,400 damage. Five minutes later two other cars collided at this spot, causing \$150 damage.

Then at 2:30 pm at the same spot seven more cars piled up, causing an estimated \$3,700 damage and two minor injuries.

Another chain-reaction crash involved nearly as many cars and nearly as much property damage on the four-lane Highway 7 section of Bathurst Street in Vaughan Town. Four of the nine cars in this \$10,000 crash had local drivers.

Another multiple crash on Highway 48 involved five cars, while there was a three-car crash on Bayview Avenue in Thornhill.

The 11-car Woodbine Avenue crash started when one driver stopped because of blinding snow.

Most of the drivers were from Toronto, but two were from York Region.

Merle Murphy, 23, of 93 Park Drive, Stouffville, was driving an Ottawa Milk Transport truck in this crash.

An Oak Ridges driver, William LeBlanc, 31, of North Road, suffered minor abrasions.

The four Woodbine Avenue crashes made it necessary for York Regional Police to bring in two additional police officers from Newmarket to help the three officers available from Vancor Detachment in Whitchurch-Stouffville.

Compiling reports on these expensive accidents were Constables Dave Knowles, Ron Lowcock and Denis Propp from Vancor, aided by Constables Tom Young and George Kidd from Newmarket.

The nine-car crash on Bathurst Street in Vaughan was at 8:45 pm. It was investigated by Constable Bob Erskine from Oak Ridges Detachment, OPP.

The last driver to hit the pile-up was Thomas Roblin of 112 Hunt Avenue, Richmond Hill.

Some of the cars were hit two or three times.

The other three local drivers in this crash were Frederick Av of 7 King High Drive, Concord; Harold Burlington of 51 Hillside Drive, Concord; and Earl Gerber of RR 1, Richmond Hill, according to police.

Several were injured at 8:15 am February 23 in a major accident on the Gormley Sideroad, a little over a mile east of Bayview Avenue.

Maple driver Leon Legros, 23, of Metro Farms, Jane Street, tried to stop on a slippery road for a car that backed out of a driveway.

His car slipped and collided with a vehicle driven by Ian Cowie, 39, of RR 1, Cedar Valley.

Cowie had \$1,000 damage and chest injuries.

Legros had \$900 damage, plus head injuries and lacerations, according to YRP Buttonville Detachment.

Mrs. Thelma Dodd of Gormley Road saw this accident.

John Collyer of 25 Clark Avenue, South Thornhill, had

about \$200 damage to his car Monday at 6 am.

It was parked in front of his home when it was hit by a car driven by Harry Morton, 31, of 960 Pharmacy Avenue, Scarborough.

Morton said his coat was caught in the car door and he was trying to pull it out when the accident happened. He had about \$350 damage, police said.

Valerie Wilson, 20, of 491 John Street, Thornhill, had about \$1,000 damage to her car in a 1:43 pm February 26 collision on Woodbine Avenue.

The other driver was Girillo Prior, 41, of 2 Courage Avenue, Downsview. He had \$10 damage and faces a charge under the Highway Traffic Act.

A Toronto car caused a three-car crash in blowing snow Sunday at 4:10 pm on Bayview Avenue about 1/2-mile south of Highway 7.

Fred Given, of 33 Rosehill Avenue, Apartment 2403, lost control of his car and it slipped backwards into the bank of snow piled at the roadside. He had about \$400 damage.

Crashing into his car came Robert McElhinney, 30, of Box 677, Oak Ridges. He had about \$200 damage.

Then came a vehicle driven by Kaalep Ots, of 43 Hogarth Avenue, Toronto. He had damage estimated at \$500, according to YRP Buttonville Detachment.

On Bayview Avenue at Royal Orchard Boulevard in Thornhill at 5:15 pm February 26 there was a two-car crash.

A car driven by Stephen Wilkinson, 18, of 40 Limcombe Drive, had about \$200 damage.

The other driver was David Scharf, 27, of 185 Shagbushy Boulevard, Apartment 1605, Willowdale. He had about \$225 damage, police said.

There was a two-car crash at 6 pm February 26 on the Gormley Sideroad, about 1/2-mile east of Concession 6.

Ray Ferguson, 50, of RR 1, Unionville, had about \$300 damage.

Stephen Winger, 17, of Claremont, had damages estimated at \$200.




