(Continued from Page 1) family court in Newmarket." The board's Chief Attendance Counsellor Michael Bennett told trustees that the jurisdiction of the new court does not coincide with the school area boundaries. The North Yonge counsellor of this board, at the

Wednesday and Friday morning, and the Newmarket Court is in session Friday mornings, he explained, so there could be conflicts in demands on attendance officers for the area. The board, he added, has to rely on other county agencies, such as the Children's Aid Society, which has its headquarters in Newmarket, and these agencies do not want to go to the Thornhill court.

All concerned services are very short staffed, Mr. Bennett said, and attendance at two courts would be very time-consuming. Markham Township Trustee John Honsberger protested, "Who are we trying to consider, ourselves or others? Which is more important, the citizen or the institution? Why do we have to take people from Steeles Avenue to Newmarket when there is a few people will have to travel 40 miles when there is a court on their doorstep."

Aurora Trustee Margaret Co-burn defended the staff position. "Each family would probably only have to do it once. For our people it would be a continuous process."

Trustee Louise Aimone of Markham Township described the court proposal as "An invidious infringement of our southern boundaries." If enough services were established on Metro's northern fringes and used by the people of the region of York, she said, the time would come when the province would declare annexation to Metro as a "fait accompli" and the area south of Highway 7 would be lost by default.

With the exception of Newmarket Trustee Jack Hadfield and Trustee Honsberger, the board supported the staff recommendation.
