Endean Nurseries

Sign Is Too Big Says Pending Town Bylaw

What does an old established firm do when it wants to erect a sign in the area of a municipality which is about to become a part of another municipality which has no sign bylaw, but which has been considering a proposed sign bylaw for the past five years?

This is the question faced by Endean Nurseries located on Yonge Street North in an area of Richmond Hill which was a part of Vaughan Township until December 31, 1970.

More than a year ago, the firm applied to the Department of Highways and received permission to erect a two-sided illuminated sign on its property. A condition of this permission was that two existing signs be removed. The new sign was commissioned to be done by Charles Signs of Toronto.

Then application was made to Vaughan Township for permission to erect the sign and the firm was advised that it should wait until after the advent of regional government and apply to Richmond Hill. Frank Endean of the nursery company told Richmond Hill

Town Council April 19. They were then informed that under the proposed sign bylaw in this town a sign would be limited to 150 square feet, either all on one side or the total of a two-sided sign. If they proceeded with the erection of their sign (already constructed) which has an area of 92 square feet on each side (a total of 184 square feet) it would contravene the bylaw as it stands when it is passed and would have to be removed.

Regional Councillor Donald Plaxton pointed out that some time will elapse before the bylaw is passed by council and then a moratorium will be needed to allow businesses to conform.

Councillor Lois Hancey noted that the proposed sign bylaw was prepared and has been revised with the old town and its problems in mind. "Perhaps we should consider establishing a category for highway commercial," she suggested.

Regional Councillor Gordon Rowe agreed, contending that property frontage and speed limit should be taken into consideration in setting size limits for signs.

The sign is ready to be erected and it seemed likely that Endean Nurseries would go ahead with its erection and take the chance that if and when the town's sign bylaw is finally passed their sign will conform to regulations.

The nurseries are located in an area now zoned residential under the Township of Vaughan's Zoning Bylaw, which will control the area until Richmond Hill passes a zoning bylaw to replace it. Since it was already in existence when the bylaw was passed it is a legal non-conforming commercial use. It has been established in that locality for more than 30 years.

Swinging Year For Union Villa

It is almost a year since Union Villa in Unionville opened its doors to senior citizens of the Region of York, and already 71 elderly men and women are making it their home.

It is a residence like no others. Where else do 80-year-old ladies take off on snowmobiles, organize their own arts and crafts groups, operate a "country store" on the premises where residents may buy their hairpins, toothpastes and other personal necessities, doing their own purchasing and keeping the books themselves?

A residents' home tour committee shows prospective residents around the Villa, and resident representatives sit on the board committees and on the residents' council, ensuring that residents are given a say in the planning of activities and other decisions affecting Union Villa.

Financial assistance from the Ontario Department of Social and Family Services in the form of a capital construction grant of \$815,000 helped build Union Villa, and the final payment was authorized recently by Minister of Social and Family Services Thomas Wells.

"Although this payment completes the department's involvement as far as building expenses are concerned, we will continue to support the Villa in the amount of 80 percent of certain of its operating costs under the Charitable Institutions Act," said Mr. Wells.

The Villa has a capacity of 163 residents, and all are encouraged to do their own thing by an interested and concerned administrator and well trained staff.

As one resident commented, "Since I have been living at Union Villa, I've had an opportunity to do things I wouldn't have even tried when I was forty years younger. Now, if you will excuse me, it is Saturday and I am going snowmobiling again."
