Accidents Take Heavy Injury Toll
King Township Boy Hit On Dufferin

A seven-year-old King Township boy was hurt at 5:10 pm Saturday when he ran into the path of a car near his home on Dufferin Street at Lot 25.

Scott Mills suffered a cut forehead and an injured right shoulder, according to York Regional Police.

There was about \$50 damage to the right front fender of the car driven by Marion Illohan, 18, of Lot 31, King Concession 8.

Several other motorists were injured in Southern York accidents last week.

Treated for minor injuries at York Central Hospital after another Sunday accident just east of Keele Street in Maple were William and Marion Armstrong of Georgetown.

Each car in the collision suffered about \$1,000, according to police.

There was also heavy damage to utilities, plus damage to the Vaughan Fire Department communication system, because a hydro transformer pole was snapped off at the base.

Firemen substituted radio communication for telephone communication for some hours and the breakage caused a false alarm at 10:05 pm at the Lands and Forests centre on Dufferin Street.

The other car in the crash was driven by Brian Cooper of Keele Street North in Maple. He escaped injury, according to the YRP.

Treated at York Central Hospital for glass cuts to his hand was Herbert Johnston, 55, of 378 Crosby Avenue, Richmond Hill.

He was one of two drivers in a collision at 7:25 am at Markham Road and Bayview Avenue.

His car had an estimated \$375 damage, police said.

The other driver was Douglas Warriner, 25, of Hubert Avenue, Toronto.

Warriner faced a careless driving charge and had damage estimated at about \$300.

Adolph Sandusky, 66, of 9751 Bayview Avenue, Richmond Hill, was charged under the Highway Traffic Act after a 9:20 pm May 2 collision on Bayview Avenue, about 1/4-mile south of 17th Avenue.

He had about \$800 damage to his car.

The other driver, Calvin Piercey, 21, of 26 Wilmington Avenue, Downsview had an estimated \$600 damage to his car.

Passenger Mary Ann Piercey, 20, hurt her right knee and head in this collision.

Charged with impaired driving and treated for a chin cut after an 11:10 pm May 4 accident at Steeles and Willowdale Avenues was a Downsview man.

John McNally, 41, of 94 Clayhall Crescent, had about \$1,000 damage to his car, according to regional police.

The other car in the crash was parked at the time. It had an estimated \$1,200 damage.

The owner was Robert Thomson of 76 Steeles Avenue East, Thornhill.

Mary Haun, 41, of Bayview Avenue, RR 1, Richmond Hill, had a bump on the head and a bruised lip after her car went out of control and hit a light standard.

It was raining when this accident took place at Bayview and Crosby Avenues at 8:30 pm May 1.

The car had about \$500 damage and there was about \$200 damage to the light standard, according to YRP.

\$800 Worth Of Malicious Damage In Richmond Hill During Weekend

There was close to \$800 worth of malicious damage done in acts of stupid vandalism in Richmond Hill last weekend.

The worst incident involved a car owned by Adrian Rossi of 180 Bayview and parked at the rear of his apartment on Saturday night.

There was at least \$450 damage to the car. Its convertible top and upholstery were slashed. The right front light and right tail light were broken.

The face of the radio was smashed.

Also at 180 Bayview Avenue, the Capri Apartments at 1:15 am Friday, May 7 a group of youths were seen outside before a glass panel three feet by seven feet, and 1/4-inch thick, was smashed in the entranceway.

Damage was about \$70. The youths fled in a car.

Also Saturday night at the Congregation, a Richmond Heights Centre boutique shop, a \$60 plate glass door was broken.

In another case of malicious damage it was fortunate somebody wasn't seriously hurt.

At 1:27 am Saturday a building brick was hurled through a large double window at the home of William Fox, 112 Trayborn Drive.

The brick flew 16 feet through a hallway and landed against a wall.

All the members of the family were asleep, so nobody was hit. The window measured about five feet by three feet. Police had no estimate of damage in this instance.

Hill Youth Convicted Of Motorcycle Theft In 1969 At Thornhill

A Richmond Hill youth Monday in York County Court at Toronto pleaded guilty to a 1969 Thornhill motorcycle theft and possession in 1970 of another stolen motorcycle.

He elected trial earlier by judge alone.

Paul Robert Finlay, 21, was given a two-year suspended sentence, plus a period of probation.

Judge Walter Martin warned Finlay he would regret it if he landed back in court again.

Given 12 Months Jail For Indecent Assault On Nine-Year-Old Girl

Indecent assault on a nine-year-old Willowdale girl cost a 61-year-old Woodbridge father of 11 a one-year jail sentence and a period on probation.

In Richmond Hill Provincial Court Friday of last week Robert Julian Morris was sentenced by Provincial Judge Robert Taylor.

Morris was originally charged with having intercourse with a girl under 14, but pleaded innocent.

He admitted the included offense of indecent assault.

The offense took place February 27 near a riding academy in Vaughan Town.

After the incident, Morris and the girl were served beer at a Woodbridge hotel before being ejected, the court was told during the trial.
