Band Concert Feature Of 155th Anniversary

A feature of the 155th anniversary of the Richmond Hill Presbyterian Church being celebrated on the weekend of June 20 will be a musical program at Bayview Secondary School on the Monday evening. This concert will feature the Metropolitan United Church Silver Band from Toronto as well as other artists. The event is being sponsored by the choir of the local church.

The band originated in 1934 and many of its 34 members have been playing in it for 20 years or more. It consists of both amateur and semi-professional musicians and exists only to serve churches in fund raising. It presents a variety of music from classics to show tunes to marches to sacred music.

Conductor Ted Robbins, former conductor of the RCAF Air Transport Command Band at Downsview and Ottawa is a noted euphonium soloist and trombonist. He has conducted the silver band for the past five years.

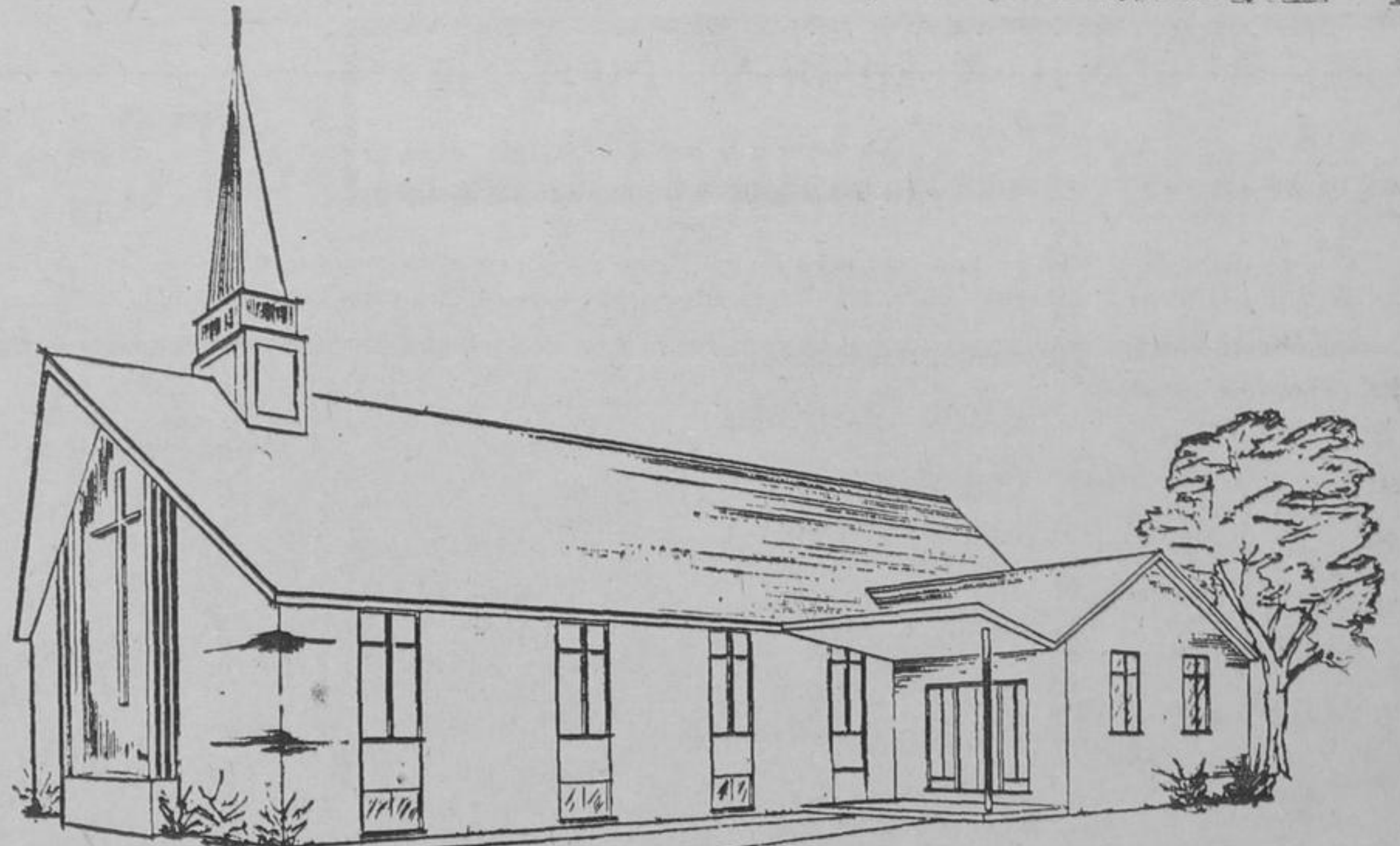
