**Warn Motorists Of Tourist Traps In Popular U.S.A. Holiday Spots**

Planning a holiday in the U.S.A. this summer? Then you will appreciate the following information about speed traps sent us by A. J. Saunders of Sarasota, Florida, a former resident. The scenario is familiar to thousands of unlucky travellers. You are travelling a well built, open highway and you pass through a small town that isn't even on the map. You fail to notice the rusted speed signs. From out of nowhere, it seems, a local policeman drives up beside you and waves you off the road. With a smile, usually, he informs you that you have just past a hidden radar, gone through an amber light or crossed the solid line. He writes a ticket, then instructs you to follow him to the justice of the peace where you are required to post bond, if you are fortunate enough to have cash or an acceptable credit card. Otherwise you may spend the night in jail. Speed traps are in some cases, a legitimate device for insuring highway safety, but often they are merely blatant gimmicks for fattening local treasuries and serve only to breed contempt for the law. Some of the most notorious speed traps in the United States are listed below: Much of the State of Delaware, where officials state they are desperately trying to control a soaring accident rate. State Police use every device in the book, including unmarked patrol cars, hidden radar and aircraft surveillance. Ludowici, Georgia. This is a little backwater town on U.S. 301, little more than a cross-roads, but is renowned for the most infamous speed traps in the country. Former Georgia Governor Lester Maddox labeled the local officials "corrupt" and erected billboards warning travellers of speed traps and clip joints. Ludowici's bag of gimmicks has even included trick lights. Southern Virginia, U.S. 301 south of Petersburg has long been regarded as a road to avoid by experienced travellers. Speed limits change abruptly where Interstate 95 merges with Route 301. Although the little town of Stony Creek, population 437, is off 301, its "corporate limits" extended across the highway and the speed limit is arbitrarily reduced. 1-64 between Richmond and Williamsburg, Virginia, brings speed limit changes suddenly when 1-64 merges with U.S. 60. The tiny town of Glen Lyn on U.S. 460, right on the West Virginia line, employs a vigorous local officer who sometimes carries a justice of the peace in the car with him, to dispense roadside service of fine collection. Other spots to avoid in Virginia include Independence on U.S. 21 and U.S. 58; U.S. 58 between Clarksville and South Hill; and U.S. 1 from McKenney to the North Carolina Line. In Ohio, South Bloomfield on U.S. 23 and Fayetteville where routes 50 and 68 intersect are two spots to avoid if possible. In South Bloomfield local police wait on the side streets to ticket violators of the trick amber light. Most cars flagged down and ticketed bear out-of-state licenses; it is reliably reported. The mayor is the town judge and levies an average fine of \$20. The mayor of Fayetteville also presides over his town's court and takes in about \$2,000 a month on speeding violations. Speed signs there are poorly placed, rusted and difficult to see at night. Glencoe, Alabama, just south of Gadsden on U.S. 431, is another town set off the highway whose limits extend over the road. This town also rakes in \$2,000 a month in traffic fines with, it is reported undue emphasis on out-of-state drivers. An AAA official frankly calls the town a "tourist trap" and urges motorists to avoid it.

**Farm Vacation Bonanza For Ontario Farmers**

A number of Ontario farmers have found a new way to add to income. About 60 of them have been offering farm vacations — a holiday on a working farm for paying guests. The response, according to the Department of Tourism and Information, has been overwhelming. A press release distributed across the continent early in the summer brought more than 600 written enquiries from as far as Mexico and Puerto Rico. Largest response came from California where the story appeared in "The Los Angeles Times." There were 289 letters and post cards. In Ontario there were 236 requests for further information, and others came from Quebec, Arizona, Connecticut, Florida, Illinois, Massachusetts, Michigan, Nebraska, New Jersey, New York, Washington. The mail response, the department reports, was prompted by a paragraph in the press release suggesting interested parties write for a free booklet, "Ontario Farm Vacations", containing listings, rates and additional information. Farmers eager to augment their income might take a cue from this response, suggests a recent release from the department.
