RT. REV. ALLAN READ  
Roots In Victoria Square  
New Suffragan Bishop

The new Suffragan Bishop of the Anglican Diocese of Toronto is Allan Read, whose grandparents were long time residents of the Victoria Square area (Concession 3 at 19th Avenue) and loyal supporters of the church there. In the year before he started university, Bishop Read who was born and raised in Toronto, spent the summer on the farm of Mr. and Mrs. Heber McCague at Victoria Square. He gave assistance to the activities of Victoria Square United Church, particularly the junior choir, that summer.

The new assistant bishop, now 48 years old, attended Forest Hill Village schools and the University of Toronto, receiving his BA in 1945 and his LTh in 1948 from Trinity College. While still a student he conducted missions in the diocese of Alberta, Edmonton and Brandon, where he found his farming experience a great asset. He also was associated with the parish of Mono East, Peel County. He was ordained to the diaconate May 2, 1948 by the Bishop of Toronto and made priest in May 1949. His first appointment was to Mono East where he served until 1954. In that year he was appointed rector of Trinity Church, Barrie, where he remained until his election as Suffragan Bishop.

In 1957 he was made a Canon of St. James' Cathedral and in 1961 was appointed Archdeacon of Simcoe.

**CITIZEN OF YEAR**  
In 1966 he was voted Barrie's "Citizen of the Year" in recognition of his service to the community. Particularly he did extensive work among prisoners at Simcoe County Jail where he was prison chaplain. He also did work among senior citizens and with youth groups.

He served as a staff member of the Diocesan Rural Training College and on the District of Barrie Board of Education. He was awarded a rural workers fellowship by the Episcopal Church in 1952. He is a member of the Royal Canadian College of Organists and has found time to work with Alcoholics Anonymous, the Boys Scouts and Sea Cadets.

Bishop Head was elected on the fifth ballot October 22 in St. James' Cathedral as the second Suffragan (assistant) Bishop to Lord Bishop of the Diocese, Rt. Rev. George Snell. However, it was evident from the first ballot, that he would be the ultimate choice.

**Reward Still Open**  
**Return Of 2 Coins**

A \$50 reward is still open to the person or persons who return or have any information pertaining to the theft of two coins from Thornhaven School for the Mentally Retarded about five weeks ago.

Doug Hinchcliffe, president of the York Central Association of Mentally Retarded, told "The Liberal" his personal offer of the \$50 still stands but he has received no response to date. "It's beginning to look hopeless," he said.

The two coins, described as irreplaceable, were presented to the school in commemoration of the inception of the Richmond Hill Coin Club in July of 1964.

The coins were taken by smashing a glass case they were enclosed in. Hinchcliffe described one of the coins as being bronze and the other silver. "They are a little larger than a silver dollar and a little thicker," he said. The coins are inscribed with the date 1964 and have the Town Crest on the back.

On the front is the inscription: "In commemoration of the inception of the Richmond Hill Coin Club, July, 1964, A.D."
