Several Drivers Facing Charges After Accidents In Richmond Hill

Quite a number of drivers were charged in serious damage accidents in Richmond Hill and Thornhill last week, but only a few motorists suffered minor injuries.

Charged with failing a breathalyzer test, impaired driving and failing to remain at the scene of an accident November 22 at 1:49 pm at Newkirk and Markham Roads was Alfred Barth, 44, of 203 Taylor Mills Drive North, Richmond Hill. Damage to his vehicle was about \$250, according to Richmond Hill Division YRP.

There was only an estimated \$20 damage to the other vehicle driven by Ronald Buckeridge, 42, of 304 Browndale Crescent, Richmond Hill.

One vehicle was a complete write-off and the other had damage estimated at \$1,500 in a crash November 20 at 5:30 pm at Newkirk Road and Centre Street in Richmond Hill under wet and foggy driving conditions.

Donald Pelletier, 53, of 5 Rockport Crescent, Richmond Hill, suffered minor injuries and was charged with failing to yield the right-of-way. His car had the \$1,500 damage estimate according to YRP.

The driver of the other car was Donald Thirgood, 21, of 8 Fairview Avenue, Langstaff. He and passenger Iris Randy, 18, of 28 Fairview Avenue, also suffered minor injuries.

Damage to the traffic lights at the intersection was estimated at \$50, YRP said.

Police are looking for the driver of a vehicle that hit a parked car and left the scene on Leventdale Road east of Yonge Street in Richmond Hill at about 11 am November 20.

There was an estimated \$175 damage to the parked car belonging to Penfold and Bromford Golf Balls Limited, 50 Doncaster Avenue, Thornhill, police said.

An Oshawa driver escaped injury November 20 at 11 am when his car went out of control on a greasy road and ripped up a Gormley area farmer's fence.

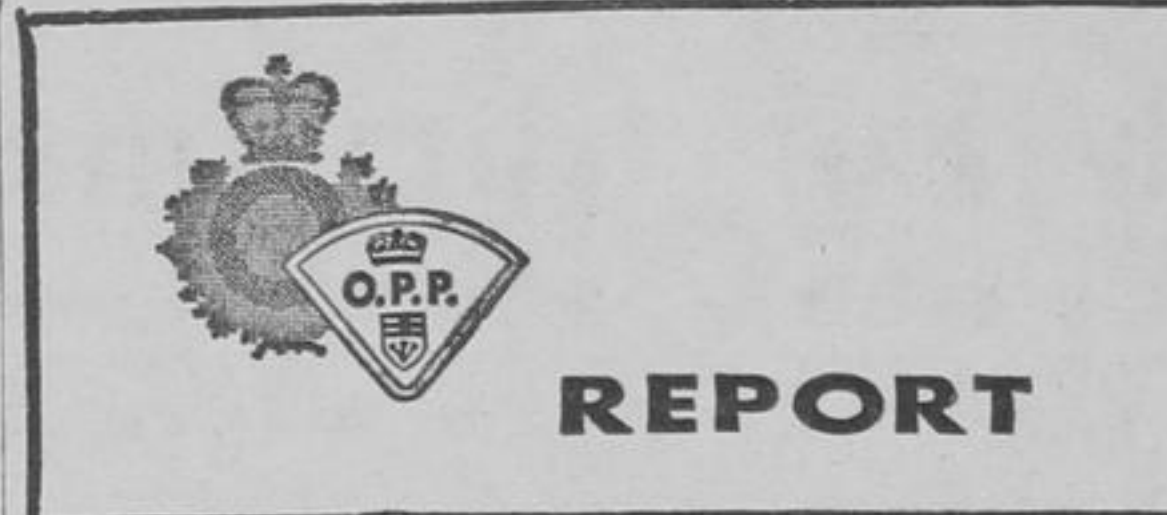

These sessions are all free and open to the public. The school is on Bayview Avenue north of Markham Road. The first three meetings dealt with family relationships, marriage relationships and teenagers.

Another death occurred on Highway 7 at Costa Road, the next day at 12:45 am when Gordon Foco, 17, of 1216 Dufferin Street, Toronto received fatal injuries. He was the driver of a car that was in collision with a car driven by Linda Miles of 49 Shaftsbury Street, Downsview. Investigating officer was Provincial Constable Keith Stacey.

Two persons were injured in a two-car collision on Highway 48 at the Vivian Road at 5:55 pm November 16. A car driven by Edward Oakes, 14 Savannah Crescent, Markham, was in collision with a car driven by Jack Newton of RR 2, Pefferlaw. Both drivers were injured and damage was estimated at \$3,000.
