29 People Killed In 26 Car Crashes

Mrs. Margaret Wells of RR 2, Aurora received treatment at York Central Hospital for injuries received in a two-car crash December 2 at 3:30 pm on Yonge Street just north of Elgin Mills. Mrs. Wells was a passenger in a car driven by her husband, Michael. Driver Audrey Lee of Newmarket, of the other car involved in the crash, also was treated at the local hospital. Damage was estimated at \$600. The accident was investigated by Provincial Constable Steve McFadden. Twenty-nine persons have been killed in 26 fatal motor vehicle collisions so far this year on provincial highways in the Region of York. Comparative figures for last year are 27 persons killed in 25 collisions.

Dave Stuart Knocks In Six Goals Doing Duty For Oak Ridges Teams

Truck Driver Fined For Drinking, Driving With Licence Suspended

The sad results of drinking and driving were underlined in the case of an unemployed Richmond Hill truck driver father in Provincial Court here on Thursday of last week. Pleading guilty to driving a truck while his licence to drive was suspended, the accused said, "I had someone driving for me most of the time. I had to pay him half my wages. I was just scraping by and had to make a living somehow." Married and the father of a family, Stewart Lawrie aged about 28 of 441 North Taylor Mills Drive was fined \$150 or 10 days in jail. He was given 15 days to pay. Judge Vanek warned Lawrie a repetition of the offence would mean a jail sentence for certain. Lawrie was also warned his vehicle could have been impounded. Ironically, Lawrie was only six days away from having his licence re-instated when he was stopped September 24 on Neal Drive in Richmond Hill. His licence was suspended June 30 for three months for impaired driving at Alliston, Crown Attorney Harry Doan told the court. Now Lawrie faces an even longer period without a licence to drive.

\$300 Fire Damage Woodbridge House

Damage was estimated at \$300 when the wall of an unoccupied house on Kipling Avenue in Woodbridge caught fire Thursday morning of last week. Maple Fire Department officials said the blaze was caused by over-heated pipes which set the living room ceiling ablaze. The house is owned by John Irvine of RR 1, Maple. Maple Firemen also answered a fire call to a home at 41 Thornebank Road in Thornhill early Friday morning. Smoke from an over-heated fan motor had resulted in the call to the fire department. There was no damage. The department also answered false alarms over the weekend including one to a service station on Highway 7 early Monday morning "in the fog." The proprietor was burning a fire in his incinerator behind the building when a passing motorist turned in the alarm. The motorist apparently was confused by the fire glowing in the fog and thought the building was ablaze.

Markham Artist Dies At Age 68

John Martin Ailsen, who lived at 154 Main Street, Markham, instructor of thousands of students during 43 years at the Ontario College of Art, died last week at the age of 68. He was best known for his oil portraits and his studies of eminent medical men are on display in hospitals across Canada. He had also been commissioned by several political leaders, including Joey Smallwood and Ross Thatcher. He is survived by his wife Marion and sons, Andrew and Adam.
