First term exams are now officially over, both the writing and receiving of results. The students of Richmond Hill High School draw deep contented breaths, thankful only that the next set begins far away in the very distant future — around March the third.

That is not to say we have been idling away our newly restored spare time. Friday marked the second in a series of newspaper recycling campaigns. Several teachers and older students lend their cars and driving ability, while two other helpers knock on doors, collecting old newspapers to be stacked in the cars and eventually recycled (for the sake of the environment). Judging by the mountainous piles of paper temporarily stored in the hall foyers, these campaigns are a great success.

The junior and senior girls' basketball teams took part in an all day inter-school exhibition tournament on Saturday, and though they did not win, put up a very good fight, losing by a mere eight points. The next scheduled game is December 9, at Woodbridge. The male basketball forces have not, as yet, made their presence felt in a real game, but that leaves us something to look forward to.

A Christmas Dance is also scheduled to take place some time in the near future, and though the exact date hasn't been set, the admission has. Any old toy will do, so that a large number can be distributed to less fortunate children for Christmas. (Whether or not this be of any great interest or significance, negotiations concerning the allowance of music in the cafeteria are beginning to look more positive).

And lastly, a scholarship fund, in honor of the late Edna Izzard, who taught English at Richmond Hill High School for some thirty years, is now in the process of being established. Plan Program For Gifted Children

(Continued from Page 1) another board. Field trips, private and group projects and challenging assignments were a part of most programs. In summarizing their findings, the committee reported that programs studied are very flexible and geared to the child's talents. They are designed to motivate and stimulate the children, involving many and varied field trips. Research and problem solving skills are stressed. Reference materials beyond those usually available for the age and grade level were provided for the gifted children. Teachers, said Wilkinson, are usually selected with great care. Stress is placed on personality, academic achievement and special training. They can also call on consultants and master teachers for support.

FAVORS ENRICHMENT
 He recommended that gifted children be taken from their home class for special enriched programs rather than segregated in another school or classroom. Enrichment, the committee agreed, is preferable to acceleration or "skipping" a grade. The teacher-librarians, said Wilkinson, should be used as support staff for the program with the library — resource centres as the workshop for the children. A consultant should be given overall responsibility for coordinating the program, and part of the consultant's duties should be the organizing of field trips to outdoor education centres, science centre, etc. In addition to pupils with an IQ of 135 or over, pupils with an outstanding talent in a specific area (such as art, music, mathematics) should be involved in these phases of the program, said Wilkinson.

SUGGESTS SPECIALISTS
 The committee recommended that departmental program consultants, who are specialists in subject areas, be involved for one project each year in their field of specialty. For example, science, mathematics, history, geography, etc. Provision should be made in the budget for the program, the committee agreed including salaries for resource people, materials, excursions, transportation and testing, this would amount to about \$245 per pupil involved. For the local board, it was estimated, the cost would be approximately \$10,000.

UNDER ACHIEVERS
 It was also recommended that an effort be made to discover and involve in the program under-achieving pupils of high ability. The report listed four requirements for admission to the program: ● That pupils enrolled in the program have an IQ of 135 or over as measured by an individual test. ● That they be socially and emotionally mature children who would benefit from the program. ● That they be recommended

by their teacher and principal. ● That the parents agree to the child's participation in the program. The report and its recommendations were accepted by the board. Trustees agreed to consider it in drawing up the budget for 1972.
