The young people of the Bible Class are planning their Candlelight service for the evening of December 19. Visitors will be most welcome to this beautiful service of carols by candlelight.

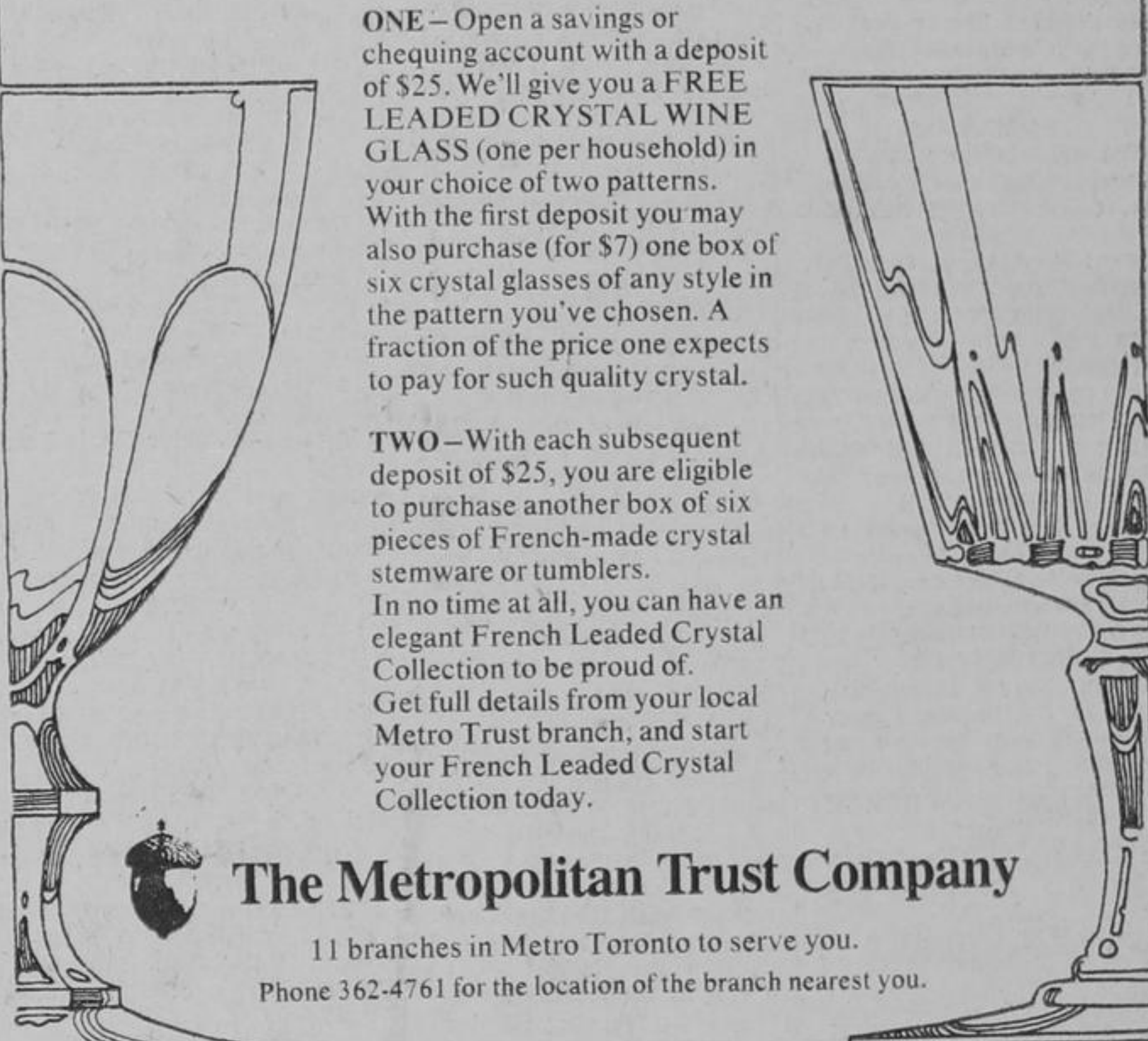
