WEEKLY COLLECTION The service provides for once a week collection from residential buildings, apartment buildings, commercial, industrial. In the event of a holiday, the area normally collected on that day will be collected on the following day. In the event of any change there will be a newspaper advertisement.

To ensure pick-up the material to be collected should be placed at the roadside not later than 7:30 am on the day of collection. On a collection day the contractor is not required to pick

up more than 10 containers or bundles or combination thereof for each commercial, industrial or institutional building and from each dwelling unit in a building.

WEIGHT LIMIT The contractor is not required to pick up material not put out in accordance with the bylaw or where the bundle or container when filled exceeds 50 pounds.

If your garbage collection needs exceed the service provided under this bylaw, then you should make private arrangements with the contractor of your choice for further service.

Former Holland Marsh Housewife Found Dead At Rochdale College

The body of a former resident of the Holland Marsh was discovered December 6 by detectives of the Metropolitan Toronto police who were investigating an attempted bank robbery.

Dead is Mrs. Marika Socolowsky, 22, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Nick Hewko of Day Street in the Marsh, King Township.

Mrs. Socolowsky's body was discovered by Metro detectives Robert Crampton and Bill Wilson in her apartment in Rochdale College on Bloor Street in Toronto.

The discovery was made following the arrest of two men near the Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce located at Bloor and Spadina Avenue shortly before noon on December 6. The bank is located about a block from the college.

SINGLE STAB WOUND An autopsy conducted by Dr. Fred Jaffe revealed the attractive mother of a four-year-old daughter had died of a single stab wound in her chest.

Mrs. Socolowsky was separated from her husband, Jerry, and had recently left her daughter, Lori, 4, with her parents on Day Street.

A neighbor at Rochdale, Charlene Godfrey, 20, described the victim as a "speed freak" in the process of being reformed by a commune of "Jesus freaks."

Miss Godfrey, one of about 15 members of Rochdale's Jesus Forever commune said: "WAS 'SPEED FREAK'." "Marika was a 'speed freak'." The college was going to evict her but they decided to give her a chance so they put her on the third floor with us."

The commune attempts to help alcoholics and drug addicts through counselling. It was Miss Godfrey who discovered her body.

Charged with non-capital murder is Daniels Provencher, 20, of Spadina Road.

Ban Searchlight Advertising The use of a searchlight in excess of 1,000 watts as an advertising device will be illegal in Richmond Hill from now on.

The restrictive bylaw, prompted by a recent incident when a mobile searchlight was in use on Yonge Street and motorists complained that it blinded them, was given three readings and passed by council at its December 13 meeting.

Mayor William Lazenby reported that the use of such searchlights also interfered with the operations of the David Dunlap Observatory, located in the southern part of the town.

The mayor commented, "The City of Tucson, Arizona, from which I received a copy of a restrictive bylaw, has found that it can get along very well without searchlights."

Dragged Out Of Car Pushed Into Window 40 Stitches At YCH A man was dragged out of a car, pushed through a plate glass window and assaulted on the sidewalk opposite 34 Yonge Street South, Richmond Hill, in the early morning hours on Friday of last week before a watching York Region Police patrol could stop the incident.

Former Holland Marsh Housewife Found Dead At Rochdale College

The body of a former resident of the Holland Marsh was discovered December 6 by detectives of the Metropolitan Toronto police who were investigating an attempted bank robbery.

Dead is Mrs. Marika Socolowsky, 22, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Nick Hewko of Day Street in the Marsh, King Township.

Mrs. Socolowsky's body was discovered by Metro detectives Robert Crampton and Bill Wilson in her apartment in Rochdale College on Bloor Street in Toronto.

The discovery was made following the arrest of two men near the Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce located at Bloor and Spadina Avenue shortly before noon on December 6. The bank is located about a block from the college.

SINGLE STAB WOUND An autopsy conducted by Dr. Fred Jaffe revealed the attractive mother of a four-year-old daughter had died of a single stab wound in her chest.

Mrs. Socolowsky was separated from her husband, Jerry, and had recently left her daughter, Lori, 4, with her parents on Day Street.

A neighbor at Rochdale, Charlene Godfrey, 20, described the victim as a "speed freak" in the process of being reformed by a commune of "Jesus freaks."

Miss Godfrey, one of about 15 members of Rochdale's Jesus Forever commune said: "WAS 'SPEED FREAK'." "Marika was a 'speed freak'." The college was going to evict her but they decided to give her a chance so they put her on the third floor with us."

The commune attempts to help alcoholics and drug addicts through counselling. It was Miss Godfrey who discovered her body.

Charged with non-capital murder is Daniels Provencher, 20, of Spadina Road.
