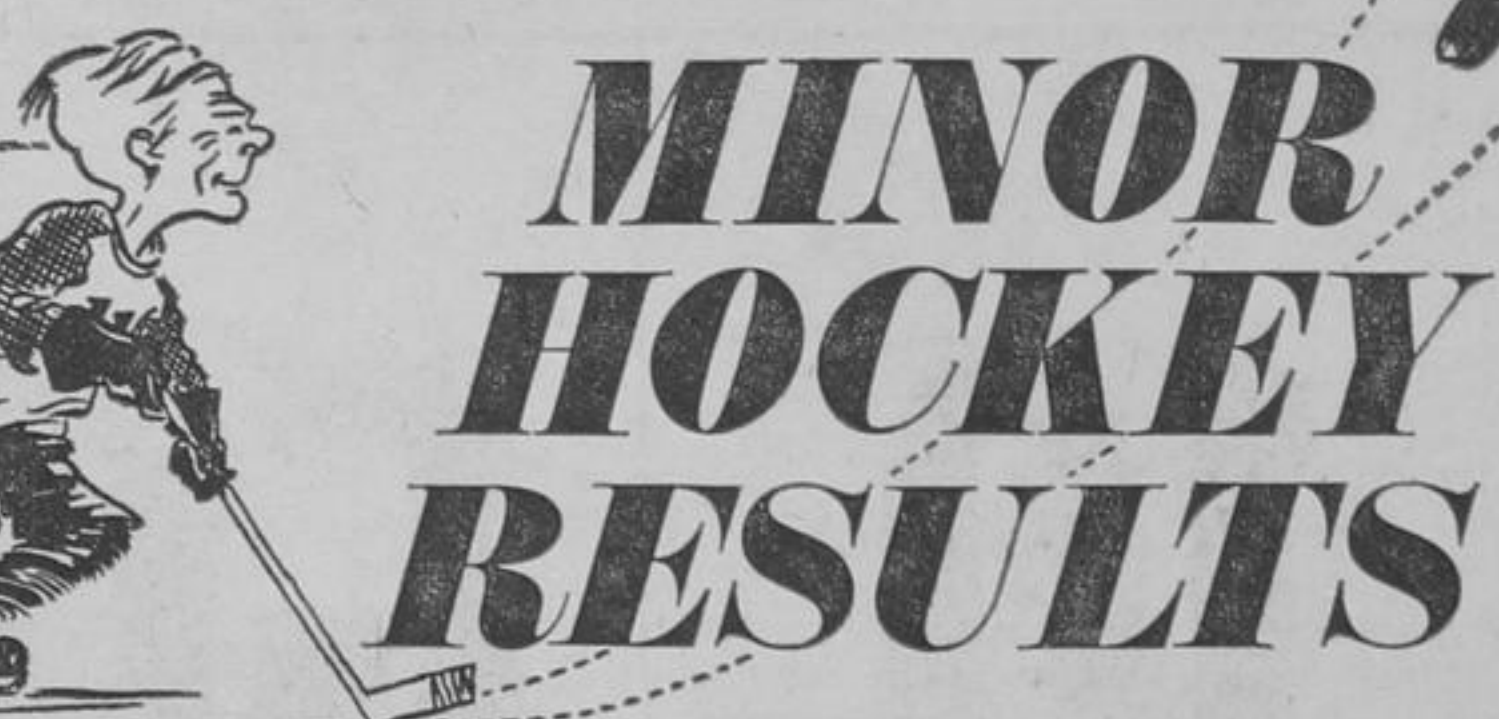

The average shooting distance away from a bird is 16 yards although as your accuracy increases with time they start throwing handicaps at you which means you move further back.

The pellets from the shotgun have a 30-inch spread but says George: "It just isn't as easy as you may think. You might think a 30-inch shotspread is big but you can miss a lot of birds."

He was especially impressed with the annual shoot-outs at Vandalia.

"When you're out there shooting," he said, "it's like being caught in the middle of a war. There's a lot of pressure on you. Especially those last two birds. They're the hardest ones to hit. It's their pressure."

George is a member of the Aurora Timberline Trap Shooting Club and gets in as much practice as possible between attending Dr. G. W. Williams Secondary School in Aurora.

"People say I'm a pretty good shot," he said. "But I feel I'm rotten. I've got a lot of improving to do if I want to be up there with the big shooters." But it looks like he's aiming in the right direction.

 Nine-year-old Lorissa Redak of 58 Arnold Avenue, Thornhill, received a fractured left leg and cuts when she was struck by a car Friday afternoon of last week while crossing Yonge Street in Thornhill.  
 Provincial Police report that the driver of the car was Thomas Danton, 46, of 32 Thorny Brae Drive, Thornhill. The Danton car was southbound when the accident occurred at 3:40 pm.  
 It was investigated by Provincial Constable Terry Hall.

Another personal injury accident occurred December 6 at 4:30 pm following a three car collision on Highway 11 (Yonge Street) at Richvale.  
 Police report a car driven by Paul Goliboski, 22, of Willowdale, entered Highway 11 from Weldrick Road after his brakes failed.  
 A southbound auto driven by Arthur Hanson, 59, of Weston, struck the Goliboski car and forced into the path of a northbound vehicle driven by Heather Wright, 29, of 192 Duncan Road, Thornhill.  
 Hanson sustained fractured knees and lacerations, Wright a broken pelvis and broken left arm and ribs.
