Considering Estimates Lights For Oak Ridges

Richmond Hill Council's works committee (Chairman David Schiller) was asked December 13 to investigate the feasibility and costs of street lighting for Highway 11 in the Richvale and Oak Ridges area.

The works committee will consult with the appropriate highway authorities before arriving at estimates which will be considered by council in connection with the 1972 town budget.

The north area is under the jurisdiction of the Ontario Hydro not of Richmond Hill Hydro. In the south, Ontario Hydro controls the east side of Yonge and Vaughan Hydro the west side.

Early this year Regional Councillor Gordon Rowe asked for lighting at the intersections of several roads in the northern area, but it was considered the estimates proved the job to be not economically feasible. This fall, after the new street lights had been installed on Yonge Street in the central core (following the reconstruction of that thoroughfare), Ward 6 Councillor Louis Wainwright pointed out the contrast between the exceptionally well-lighted Yonge Street in the old town and the unlighted portion to the south. Mr. Wainwright felt the intersections at least should be lighted in the interests of safety.

Since the earlier estimate of cost in the north included intersections other than the ones on Yonge Street, new estimates will have to be secured for both areas.

The program is designed to provide work for the unemployed at worthwhile projects that might not otherwise be included in the budget for the year.

The board approved Laframboise's recommendation that the money be used for painting, cutting dead trees and incidental repairs.
