

At the same time, council agreed to consider the costs of the project in its 1972

The proposed park, as envisioned by the firm of Johnson Sustronk Weinstein Associates Limited, would adjoin the Stornoway Public School on the west. It's located south of Highway 7 and west of Bayview Avenue, and is in a new area encircled by Romfield Cir-

The site is five to six acres of relatively flat land. With the exception of a few trees near Baymark Road and the remains of a hedge row in the north central portion, the




