The extended Bell Telephone service on December 19 for 887 customers to Don Mills, Willowdale and parts of Toronto is much appreciated by local residents.

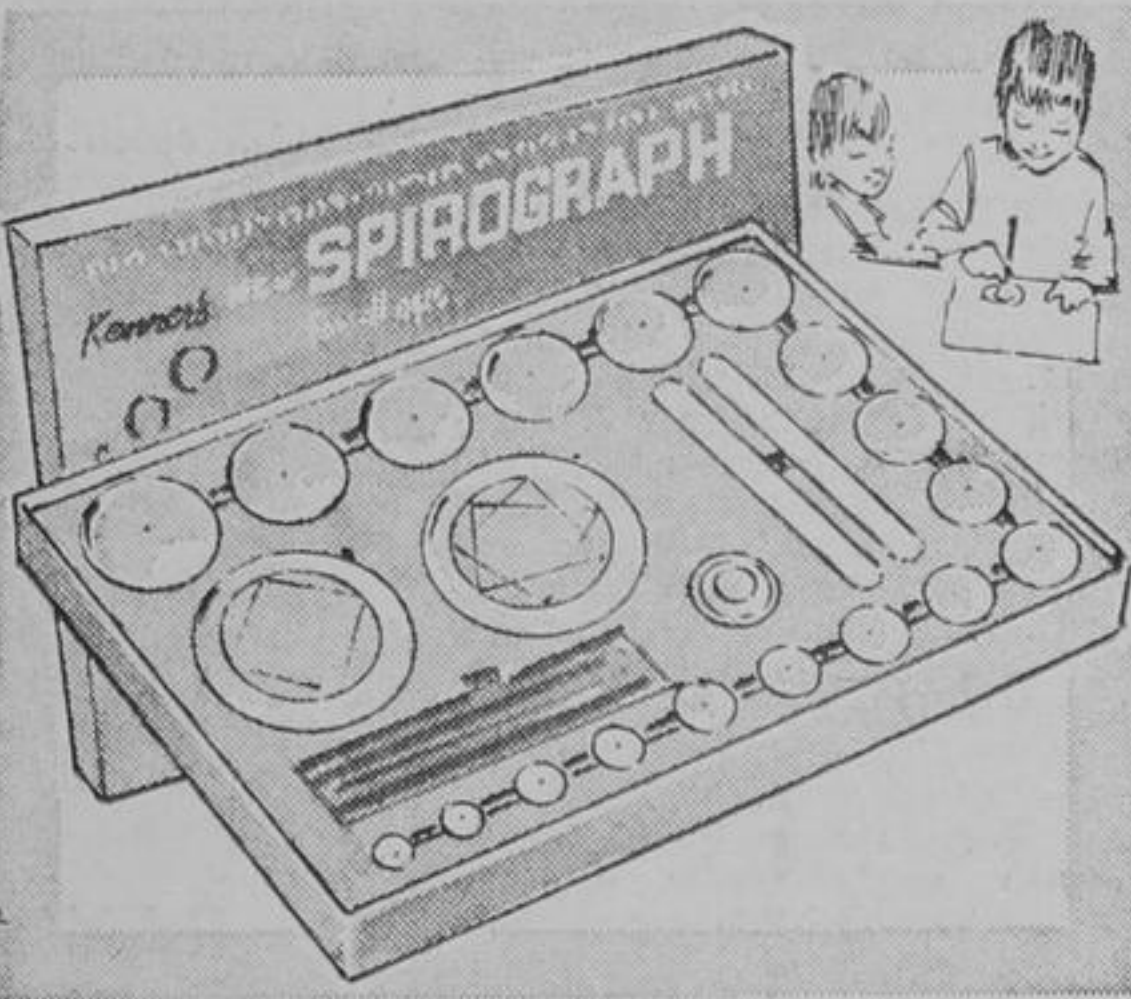

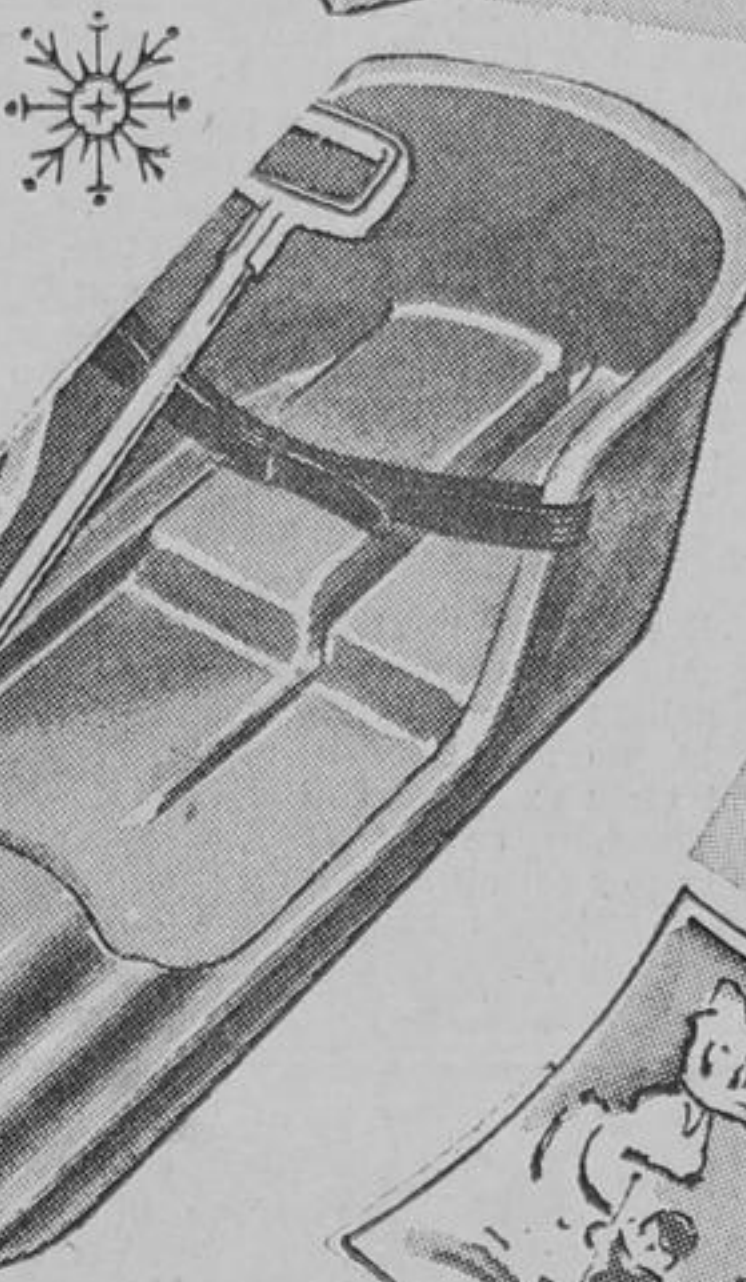

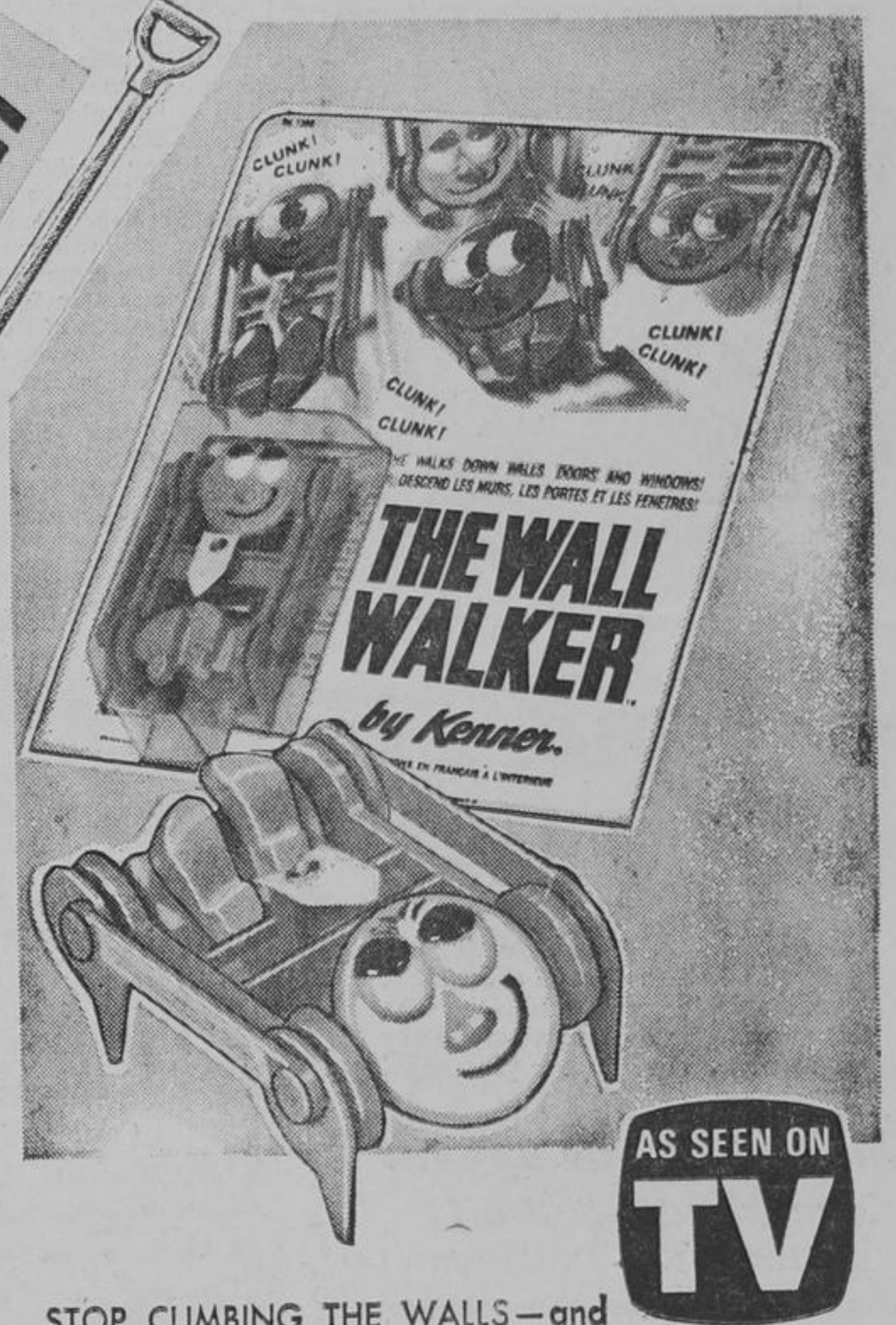
