Mrs. Thayer Hepburn, for many years a Gormley resident, suffered a bad fall and is a patient in the Royal Victoria Hospital in Barrie.



Bremner, led in carol singing. Santa Claus (Mrs. John Gamble) distributed the Christmas Gifts. A social half hour followed.








