Thornhill's OMHA Minor Peewees Win Don Mills Consolation Trophy

Thornhill OMHA Minor Peewees, sponsored by H & S Reliance Limited, participated in the Annual Don Mills Atom Tournament over the Christmas Holidays. They played six games, winning the last four in a row to take the Consolation Championship.

Thornhill out-played York Mills in this game but Jamie Davidson was required to make several fine stops in the Thornhill goal.

The fifth game was no place for any fans with nerve problems, as Thornhill came up against the powerful Kitchener entry. The first period was all Kitchener's, and they quickly built up a 2-0 lead.
