Unlike a player, the referee doesn't get a break of approximately six minutes after every three minutes on the ice. Referees have to skate full out to keep up with the play for the full game. He must study the rule book constantly. He must have the best skates available (about \$75-80 a pair) as he can be in and on those skates for upwards of three hours at a time. He wears equipment similar to that worn by a player, mostly hidden and all purchased
