Two extra kindergarten sand, classes were served this year, an extra bus was needed in Markham and a full bus in Keswick, approximately 300 miles were added to the routes because of increased enrolment and an extra bus was needed to serve Metro high schools.

Five board owned buses transport 711 students at an estimated daily cost of \$150 or 21c per pupil. Three buses are used to transport 145 students to high schools in Metro-94 are in grades 9 and 10 and 52 in grades 11, 12 and 13. Estimated daily cost is \$1.72 or \$1.18 per student.

Board owned buses also were used for 103 excursions and private carrier buses for three excursions. Taxi service, with the exception of a few special cases, has been cut to a minimum. During the fall term of 75 days the taxi bill was \$828. This has been reduced by \$145 for the balance of the year.


