**The Council Of The Regional Municipality Of York Proposes To Pass A By-Law Authorizing:**

Bathurst Street (No. 38) —

The widening of Bathurst Street (Regional Road No. 38) in the Town of Richmond Hill, the Town of Vaughan and the Township of King from Elgin Mills Road (Regional Road No. 49) to King Road (Regional Road No. 11) to a basic width of 120 feet with additional widenings at intersections, cuts and fills; the grading and graveling thereof; the paving thereof to provide a two-lane roadway, with additional turning lanes at intersections, together with the construction of all related works and undertakings and the acquisition of the necessary lands and interests in lands.

The Regional Engineering Committee will, at its meeting to be held at 2:00 p.m. on the 16th of May, 1972, at the Regional Engineering Building on the west side of Don Mills Road one and one-quarter miles north of the Aurora Sideroad, hear personally or by counsel, solicitor or agent, any person who claims that his lands will be prejudicially affected by the by-law and who applies to be heard.

Plans showing the proposed works may be inspected at the office of David Hill, Director of Property, at the Engineering Building on the west side of Don Mills Road one and one-quarter miles north of the Aurora Sideroad (Tel.: 895-2303).

**Caretaking College Seneca Gives Course**

Separate school caretakers are now going to college. Business Administrator Percy Laframboise reported to York County Roman Catholic School Board April 18. At least college is coming to them.

A course in caretaking, which will require 30 hours on 20 Saturday mornings, is now in progress at Our Lady Help of Christians School, Bayview Avenue, Richmond Hill. It is being presented by Seneca College.
