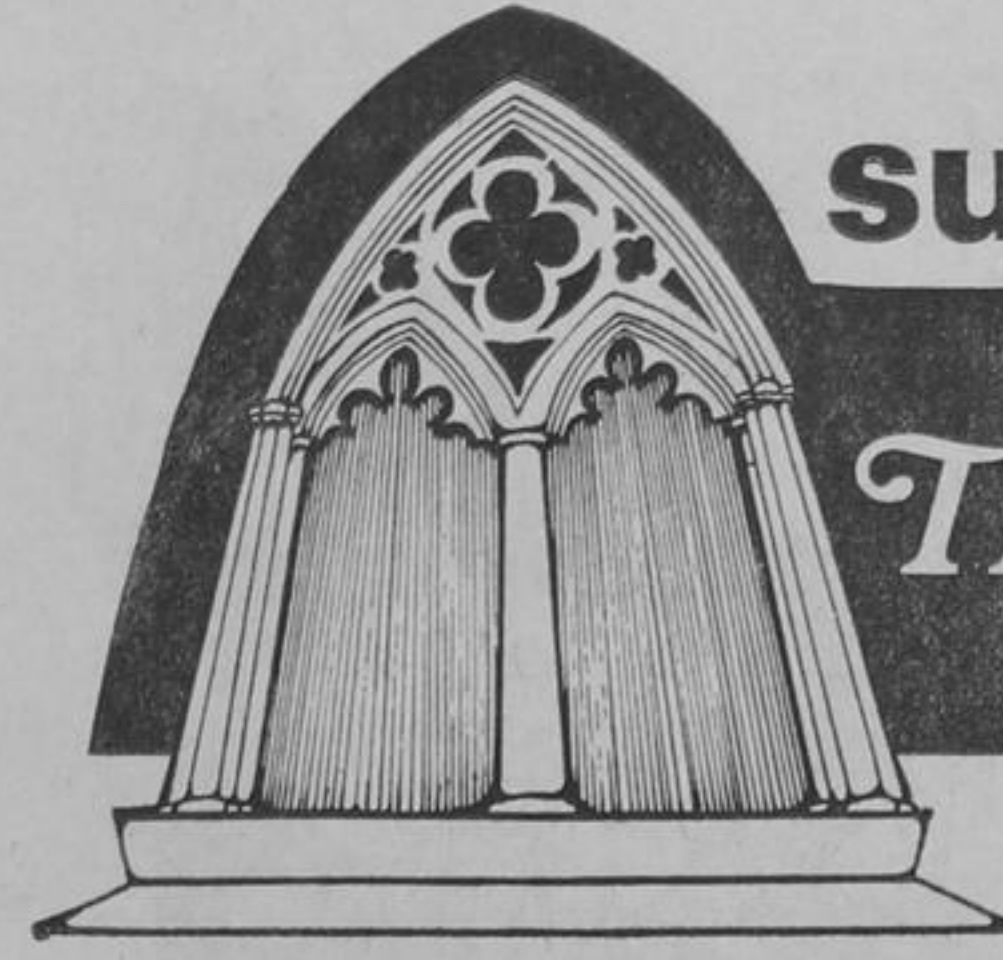

Vaughan Town Briefs

During the summer months all general meetings of Vaughan Council will take place in the afternoon, except for planning committee meetings which will be in the evening.
 At a meeting June 5, council agreed to meet at 3 pm June 19, July 10, July 31, August 21 and September 11.
 General committee meetings will be at 4 pm July 4, July 24, August 14, September 5 and September 25.
 Planning committee will meet Tuesdays at 8 pm - June 20, July 11, August 1, August 22, September 12.
 It was agreed, however, that if citizens wish to appear at any of these meetings and cannot arrange to attend in the afternoon, meetings will be convened to after supper. If it is necessary for the convenience of the public, said Mayor Garnet Williams, council could attend to routine business in the afternoon, have a lunch brought in and then hear delegations in the evening.
 Vaughan Council has authorized a trip to Winnipeg for Town Engineer Richard Kraft. The engineer will be a delegate to the Roads and Transportation Study Convention October 2 to 5 at an estimated cost of \$350.
 Vaughan Council last week approved the low tender bid for replacement of sidewalks and curbs around the municipal offices — after the work had been done.
 Bids ranged from \$1,706.25 to \$2,573. The contract was awarded to Ventrella Brothers Construction Limited, and the sidewalks and curbs were in place when council met June 5 to approve the low tender.
