

Sign Contest Winners Meet The Mayor

Vaughan Council is delighted with the response to its sign contest. Residents of the municipality were invited to submit ideas for signs representative of the new Town of Vaughan.

The 42 entries, many of them from children, were judged by a sign committee - Michael Bevan of Emery Secondary School in North York, Gordon Slack of the Ministry of Transportation and Communication, and Gary Schlee of the Woodbridge and Vaughan News.

Signs were chosen on the basis of practicality, readability, stability and appearance with numbers, not names, on each entry.

Six signs were selected and referred to council for final judging. Council chose the design submitted by Alice Wcislo of Kleinburg, pictured above with Mayor Garnet Williams. It incorporates the crest of Vaughan within a border of varying shades of green.

Second prize went to Arthur Bacher of Maple, and third prize went to Mrs. Mary Norcliffe, Maple. Named for honorable mentions were Roy Rice and Barbara Rice of Thornhill and Jean Walsh of Woodbridge.

Cash awards of \$100, \$50 and \$25 were made to the three prize winners. A professional sign company will be asked to advise on the type of background material and coloring to be used and give an estimate of cost before a final choice is made.

Presentation of prizes took place in the mayor's office on June 12.
