Dr. Omond Solandt Named To Study Construction Hydro Line

A ray of hope was offered to residents of King Township and adjoining municipalities by the June 22 announcement of Premier William Davis that his government has appointed a oneman advisory commission on the construction by Hydro of up to three 500 KV lines from the Nanticoke Generating Station on Lake Erie to the Pickering Generating Station east of Toronto. The rightof-way would cut a swath up to 610 feet wide upon which towers and lines would be constructed along a 140-mile route. King and Whitchurch-Stouffville residents were among the people instrumental in presenting a protest petition bearing signatures of 5,084 residents of 11 townships along the proposed route to the Premier in late

The petition decried the taking over by hydro of more

than 10,000 acres of prime Southern Ontario land, charged that the proposed transmission line design is wasteful, out-dated and ignores recognized good practice, and recommended that an alternate route be chosen.

The Premier named Dr. Omond Solandt to carry out the study, as a one-man advisory commission with broad terms of reference and all necessary powers under the Public Inquiries Act. Dr. Solandt will submit his report to the government through Allan Lawrence, the Provincial Secretary for Resources Development.

"Dr. Solandt has had a distinguished career in the public service field, where his particular knowledge and experience in the sciences has been widely recognized," the Premier said. "He was formerly chairman of the

board and the scientific member of the Chiefs of Staff Committee and Defence Council and later became chairman of the Defence Research Board. He retired in May from his position as chairman of the Science Council of Canada, hav- thereafter. ing served in that position

him to examine and report on, among other things, the mode of transmission, the quantity of power, voltage and number of circuits required, the routing of the transmission corridor, the timing of construction, the design of service installations, such as towers, and transforming stations, ecological practices in maintaining the corridor, alternative methods for determining the routing of future transmission corridors and other related considerations.

It is expected that Dr. Solandt will provide opportunity for interested municipalities, organizations and individuals to present their views. The government hopes to have his report by mid-September or shortly

Aware that the matter is The government has asked a highly complex and technical one and that an increasing number of issues of this kind will continue to arise. Premier Davis reported that he and his colleagues "have been examining the possibility of establishing a permanent environmental protection agency with a high degree of technical and scientific competence, which would serve the growing need for exercise, continuing research and the gathering of available scientific and technical data and information relating to environmental questions." The Preimer pointed out

that The Toronto Star in a June 13 editorial, recommended a federal environmental council, which would not only supervise environmental impact studies, but also conduct cost-benefit analysis of proposed major projects. He said his government would be prepared to support such an undertaking, but "we cannot wait too long for it," and will give very serious consideration to establishing its own environmental protection organiza-


